INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Ezekiel 33:7 - 9

God called the prophet as a watchman for the house of Israel. Unless those called by God try to turn the wicked away from evil, they will not be saved. When holy people speak up in God's behalf, they are saved.

SECOND READING: Romans 13:8 - 10

*All commandments are summed up in this: "You shall love your neighbor as *yourself. Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of *the law."

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 18:15 - 20

Jesus said, "If two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

Our first reading and Gospel today give us a model to follow when difference arise among us. The way to follow this model is to love one another, as Paul exhorts us to do in the second reading. Yet listen for Jesus' advice for how to deal with someone who is instransignet: "treat him as you would a Gentle or a tax collector." How did Jesus treat them? What does that mean for you?

LITURGY AND WORD

A man approached St Francis of Assisi and asked him, "Brother Francis, I am in a quandary. In the Bible it says we should rebuke sinners, but I see people sinning all the time. I don't feel like I should go around rebuking everybody." St Francis thought and then said, "What you must do is to live in such a way that your life rebukes the sinner – how you act will call others to repentance." Today's people seem to be experts in finding out the faults and failures of others. People feel proud and satisfied to exaggerate the limitations, shortcomings and failures of others and rebuke and belittle them uncharitably. Jesus very clearly reprimanded us by telling, "Why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye and not see the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother: "Come, let me take the speck out from your eye", as long as that plank is in your own? Jesus expects each one of us his disciples to become aware of our faults and failures so that the fraternal corrections that we want to make will be more credible and effective.

Today's first reading and the gospel challenge us. Prophet Ezekiel tells us, "If I say to the wicked, O wicked man, you shall surely die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from his way, that wicked man shall surely die in his iniquity, but his blood I will require at your hand". Jesus tells us "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault." Both the Prophet and Jesus tell us that the other who does a wrong thing deserves help and timely corrections so that he or she may come away from his or her faults and lead a worthy life. According to Ezekiel we need to become "watchmen" for others and for Jesus we should consider the other who wrongs us as a brother or sister and should correct him or her in love and understanding. It's indeed a daunting task and yet we have no option other than to accomplish the commandment of Jesus.

LITURGY AND WORD CONT'D

In a poem entitled, "The Perfect Church" by an unknown author, we read: I think I shall never see a church that's all it ought to be; church whose members never stray beyond the straight and narrow way! But still we'll work and pray and plan to make our own the best we can." In spite of the fact that we are saved by the death and resurrection of Jesus, we still continue to be stubborn, selfish, sarcastic, sinister, scandalous and senseless. We pretend that we are living in a sinless world. Even if there are sins, they are committed by others. St Paul reminds us, "Because all have sinned and all have fallen short of the glory of God" (Rom 3:23). Jesus knows that we have gone away from the love of the Father and to bring us back he gave us his life. Jesus reminds, "For your heavenly Father does not want even one of these little ones to be lost" (Mt 18:14). God has but one will: to save people, including you and me! The Good Shepherd gave his life for us! God's singular will is to seek and save us which he did in baptism and his continued presence in our lives through his Word and Sacraments. God has but one will: to save people including those who once belonged to his fold but who wandered away from him. Just as the shepherd left the 99 to find the lost sheep so our Good Shepherd exhorts all of us to become "shepherds" – to leave the cozy confines of our comfortable living rooms to search and find the sheep that have wandered away from the fold. God's love compels us to seek and save the lost.
