INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Isaiah 61:1 - 2a, 10 - 11

The Spirit of the Lord God enabled Isaiah to proclaim good news to the poor, healing to the brokenhearted, liberty to captives, and freedom to prisoners.

SECOND READING: 1 Thessalonians 5:16 - 24

Paul exhorted the faithful of Thessalonica to "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus."

GOSPEL READING: John 1:6 - 8, 19 - 28

•John the Baptizer was not the light but testified to it. He declared himself "the evoice of one crying out in the desert, make straight the way of the Lord."

Some very important people in scripture give testimony today. First, Isaiah testifies that God called him to share good news to those in need. Then St. Paul testifies to the expectations he has of the Thessalonians as he wraps up his letter them. Finally, John the Evangelist writes that John the Baptist was sent to testify to the greatest news of all, the coming of Jesus, so that all may believe.

LITURGY AND WORD

The book of Isaiah is actually a collection of three books whose authors are identified as Isaiah, Second Isaiah and Third Isaiah. Third Isaiah is the name given by scholars to the author of the last eleven chapters of the book of Isaiah (56-66). The content of Third Isaiah is similar to Second Isaiah (40–56) but reflects a slightly later period when the restoration of Jerusalem was underway. Essentially, Third Isaiah envisions God creating new heavens and new earth and giving people a chance once more to live in righteousness, justice and peace. The great vision of Isaiah 61:1-4 (1st Reading) about liberty to captives, binding up the broken hearted and good news to the oppressed must have been well received by the Jewish exiles as they went home from Babylon to restore their lives. The First Reading contains two songs: (1) The song of the Lord's Anointed and (2) The song of the justified. As far as the first song is concerned, Jesus quotes this poem in his inaugural speech in the synagogue of Nazareth and announces that the messianic era has come (Lk 4:16-21). Each phrase of this song is rich in biblical tradition. The spirit of which the prophet speaks had been promised to the messianic king (Isa 11:1-2) and later was assured to all the messianic people (Joel 3; Zech 12:10). The word anointed is linked with preaching and hearing; it designates an interior enlightening to know God's word and a strengthening to follow it. The poem also speaks of prisoners being led out of dark dungeons to the brightness of daylight. Throughout this poem the author looks to the total salvation of God's people – bodily and spiritually, individually and socially. The second song (vv 10-11) depicts the nuptial joy of Zion clothed with salvation and righteousness and becoming a holy "shoot" before all the nations. In this song the author likens salvation to the growth of plants in the garden which are cultivated and tended.

LITURGY AND WORD CONT'D

In the Second Reading Paul exhorts the Thessalonians to pray for an abiding attitude of joy, prayerfulness and thanksgiving. Spiritual gifts and especially prophecy are not to be suppressed in the community, but to be discerned. The exhortation concludes with a prayer for the total sanctification of the Thessalonians so that they may be wholly blameless at the second coming of Christ. Paul says that God himself is personally concerned for them. He is the source of the spiritual blessings, and therefore it is right to pray that he may enable those who are called "saints" to become more and more saintly in their whole being. Paul is thinking of an ongoing process and expects that when the Lord returns he will find his people completely blame-
