

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Genesis 15:1 - 6; 21:1 - 3

Abram and Sarah put faith in the Lord, and gave the name Isaac to their son. •Your descendants shall be as numerous as the stars in the heavens.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 11:8, 11 - 12, 17 - 19

The descendants of Abraham and Sarah are "as numerous as the stars in the sky •and as countless as the sands on the seashore." Abraham's faith was tested.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 2:22 - 40

Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to the temple to be consecrated. Simeon, a •holy and pious man, took the child in his arms, and Anna, the prophetess, gave thanks to God.

The feast of the Holy Family has a choice of readings. Sirach and St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians concentrate on the family and our calling to treat each other as believers in the Lord and as Christians. The alternative readings about Sarah and Abraham tell of God fulfilling the promise of Abraham that he would have descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky. The Gospel then portrays the devotion of Mary and Joseph, traveling to Jerusalem to present Jesus to God.

NOTE: *The reception of Holy Communion, in Catholic teaching, indicates an* agreement of faith, on the recipient's part, with the Catholic doctrine of Jesus' real presence in this sacrament. Catholics observe a Eucharistic fast of one hour prior to receiving communion. Therefore, it is inappropriate to have any food, candy, gum, etc., in your mouth while in church. Having shared in the Eucharist, you are compelled to go and work for peace and justice, thereby building God's Kingdom now.

The Apostolic Exhortation on Love in the Family by Pope Francis (Amoris Laetitia) is the Papal document on the family. The Pope offers exhortations on the various issues that trouble the families. Relevant paragraphs from chapter three of Amoris Laetitia that deal with family issues are presented below for our consideration. This brief chapter summarizes the Church's teaching on marriage and the family. The Synod Fathers noted that Jesus, "in speaking of God's original plan for man and woman, reaffirmed the indissoluble union between them. The indissolubility of marriage - 'what God has joined together, let no man put asunder' (Mt 19:6) – should not be viewed as a 'yoke' imposed on humanity, but as a 'gift' granted to those who are joined in marriage. God's indulgent love always accompanies our human journey; through grace, it heals and transforms hardened hearts, leading them back to the beginning through the way of the cross. The Gospels clearly present the example of Jesus who proclaimed the meaning of marriage as the fullness of revelation that restores God's original plan. (cf. Mt 19:3)" Jesus began his public ministry with the miracle at the wedding feast of Cana (cf. Jn 2:1-11). He shared in everyday moments of friendship with the family of Lazarus and his sisters (cf. Lk 10:38) and with the family of Peter (cf. Mk 8:14). He sympathized with grieving parents and restored their children to life (cf. Mk 5:41; Lk 7:14-15). In this way he demonstrated the true meaning of mercy, which entails the restoration of the covenant. Marriage is a vocation, inasmuch as it is a response to a specific call to experience conjugal love as an imperfect sign of the love between Christ and the Church. Consequently, the decision to marry and to have a family ought to be the fruit of a process of vocational discernment. Sexual union, lovingly experienced and sanctified by the sacrament, is in turn a path of growth in the life of grace for the couple. It is the "nuptial mystery." The meaning and value of their physical union is expressed in the words of consent, in which they accepted and offered themselves each to the other, in order to share their lives completely. Neither of the spouses will be alone in facing whatever challenges may come their way. Both are called to respond to God's gift with commitment, creativity, perseverance and daily effort. They can always invoke the assistance of

of the Holy Spirit who consecrated their union, so that his grace may be felt in every new situation that they encounter. Marriage is firstly an "intimate partnership of life and love" which is a good for the spouses themselves, while sexuality is "ordered to the conjugal love of man and woman." It follows that "spouses to whom God has not granted children can have a conjugal life full of meaning, in both human and Christian terms." Nonetheless, the conjugal union is ordered to procreation "by its very nature." The child who is born "does not come from outside as something added on to the mutual love of the spouses, but springs from the very heart of that mutual giving, as its fruit and fulfilment." He or she does not appear at the end of a process, but is present from the beginning of love as an essential feature, one that cannot be denied without disfiguring that love itself.
