

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Isaiah 7:10 - 14

The Lord offered Ahaz a sign. Ahaz answered, "I will not ask! I will not tempt the Lord!" Nevertheless, the Lord gave a sign: "The virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel."

SECOND READING: Romans 1:1 - 7

Paul told the Romans he was called to be an apostle and set apart to proclaim the gospel of God about Christ Jesus. He said to them, "We have received the grace of apostleship" that we may spread the name and bring to faith all those called to belong to Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL: Matthew 1:18 - 24

Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they wed, Mary became pregnant through the power of the Holy Spirit. Joseph decided to break the engagement. He changed his mind when an angel in a dream told him to receive Mary as his wife.

Today's readings are about signs: God's sign to Ahaz, the angel's appearance to Joseph. As we hear God's holy word proclaimed today, what signs in your life point to God about to do wonderful new things? How can you respond like Joseph?

LITURGY AND WORD

God does not interfere with human freedom but intervenes in our life at important

moments so that we do his will. As we

approach the Nativity of Our Lord the Mother Church recalls some important 'events' which help us to recognize the divine intervention in our life and prepare the way for the first coming of the Lord. Today's readings enumerate at least three stages of this preparation: the prophecy, the fulfilment and the new life of grace and peace of Our Lord Jesus Christ. a) In and through his prophetic word the Lord prepares his people before his arrival: The kingdom of Israel, also known as Ephraim, joined forces of Syria against Assyria in the battle called the Syro-Ephraimte War (fought in 735-733 BCE). Both Ephraim and Syria asked Ahaz, the king of Judah, to join them against Assyria. But he refused and asked Assyria for the help. In 733 BCE Samaria, the capital of Israel was captured. Ahaz, the king of Judah, had to remain in Jerusalem as an Assyrian subject Ahaz preferred to remain a subject to an earthly king than to ask for a prophetic sign from God which is recorded in today's First Reading (Isaiah 7:10-14). This sign marks the beginning of a new era in the salvation history of Israel. But the king did not take the sign seriously and met a tragic end. God promises a new beginning but man compromises with an old past which can lead him to doom and destruction. b) Fulfilment of Prophecy precedes Divine Intervention: In today's Gospel (Matthew 1:18-24) Joseph seems to be unaware of the work of the Holy Spirit in the conception of Jesus in the womb of Mary. The angel of the Lord intervenes in Joseph's way of thinking. The evangelist tells us that this happened in order to fulfil the prophecy of Isaiah: "a virgin shall be with child..." Later Joseph could name the child Jesus because of this intervention. Without divine intervention fulfilment of a prophecy can remain a mystery. Many of God's promises remain unfulfilled in our life because we do not take the divine intervention seriously in our life and change our way of thinking. c) The new life of Grace and Peace invites

c) The new life of Grace and Peace invites the faithful to humble oneself: In today's Second Reading (Romans 1:1-7) St Paul makes the Romans aware of their calling to be saints. He himself is aware of his apostleship and God's grace at work in him. All these divine gifts are meant to humble a person in the eyes of God, acknowledging God's grace rather than relying solely on human efforts and intellect. In what way does the Lord intervene in my life? In what way the prophetic word of God and the grace of Our Lord Jesus are helping me to prepare for the coming of the Lord?

You shall eat the fruit of the labour of your hands; you shall be happy, and it shall go well with you. Your wife will be like a fruitful vine within your house; your children will be like olive shoots round your table. Thus shall the man be blessed who fears the Lord. The Lord bless you from Zion! May you see the prosperity of Jerusalem all the days of your life! May you see your children's children! Peace be upon Israel!" (Ps 128:1-6).
