THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Isaiah 8:23 - 9:3

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Those who lived in the land of gloom now have joy, for the yoke that burdened them God has smashed.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:10 - 13, 17

Paul wrote to the people of Corinth: let "there be no divisions among you ... be united in mind and in the same purpose." I have heard "that there are rivalries among you ... Is Christ divided?"

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 4:12 - 23

Jesus said to Simon Peter and Andrew, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Immediately they followed him. Jesus began to proclaim this: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." He cured many people. Our first reading from Isaiah sounds as if we were still in the Christmas season: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." But paired with today's Gospel, which repeats that phrase, it makes a powerful prelude to the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and the calling of the first apostles. Jesus' response to John the Baptist's arrest is to begin his announcement of the kingdom of heaven. How can today's word of God help us to respond to adversity?

LITURGY AND WORD

Capernaum in Galilee is the scene of the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. Capernaum is situated on the Northwest shore of the Sea of Galilee in the general area allotted to the tribes of Zebulon and Naphtali. It is a substantial distance (about 50 kms) from Nazareth, which is in the centre of Lower Galilee. If any city can be called the home-base of Jesus' ministry in Galilee, it was Capernaum.

Matthew has a penchant for fulfillment

quotations. He quotes Isaiah about people who walked in darkness seeing a great light. Those who walk in darkness see nothing; they are anxious and afraid, and so according to the Old Testament they are already in the power and the realm of the underworld and of death. Their relationship with God is blotted out, so they are far from him. Conversely, those who are in the light can look around and make use of what they have been offered. Here men feel joy as beings who realize themselves through action. However, as the brightness of the world is threatened by the darkness of death, they need the presence and saving concern of God, so that they do not experience this world as a place of danger and this life as a burden, but rather see it as the place and possibility for free and happy action. Thus God's presence is the source of the light which shines on the life of the individual or on the whole people. The first step that Jesus takes in the realization of his mission is the choosing of disciples. Galilee is the place in which Jesus' public ministry began. Except for the final days in Jerusalem his ministry was confined to Galilee according to the Synoptic Gospels; John presents Jesus going back and forth between Galilee and Jerusalem. In Jesus' time Galilee was a small area bounded on the East by the Jordan River and the Sea of Galilee, on the South by Samaria, and on the North and west by Syro-Phoenicia.

In Jesus' time Galilee was under the political control of Herod Antipas, a son of Herod the great. After 6 A.D. when Archelaus, the brother of Herod Antipas, was relieved of his control over Judea, that district was administered by a series of Roman governors, the most famous of who was Pontius Pilate (AD 26-36).

Jesus calls his first disciples: Simon Peter and Andrew, James and John. The lack of preparation, the simple commands given by Jesus, and the immediate responses all underline the attractiveness and personality of Jesus.

LITURGY AND WORD CONT'D

The periscope also serves to introduce the members of Jesus' inner circle, who will accompany him to Jerusalem and become eye witnesses of the events that would take place there. To a Jewish audience the dynamics of the call of the first disciples would have seemed unusual. It was customary in Jewish circles that disciples should search out a teacher. Here, however, Jesus takes the initiative by choosing and summoning those whom he wanted to be his disciples. In order to belong to Jesus, we also must be chosen by him. The choice of fishermen did not go in vain. Peter became the unopposed leader of the group of apostles. His prominence and influence is huge even today. John, another disciple, gave us the most spiritual of the Gospels. By offering ourselves, we can also become part of the mission that Jesus accomplished and which should be continued.
