### LITURGY AND WORD

Jesus became man to liberate people from sin and death through His suffering and death on the cross and by his resurrection. Knowing that the time to fulfill the plan of His Father is fast approaching, Jesus warns His disciples of His suffering and death, as we find in the latter part of Matthew's Gospel (Cf. chs 16, 17, 20). The disciples who were dreaming of a Messiah who would liberate the Jews from the foreign domination and give them an independent nation could not understand what the Lord was telling them. Therefore, before this takes place Jesus wants to give to them an experience of the glory of Him as the Son of God. Hence He takes Peter, James and John to the top of a mountain, Mount Tabor; and in front of them He was transfigured. There appeared to them Moses and Elijah with Him and they hear the voice of the Father: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to

The Transfiguration was an important event for the apostles. It had a purpose: it prepared them for the Paschal Mystery, especially the humiliating death of their Master. It helped them to understand and, later, interpret correctly the meaning of the death and resurrection of Jesus. It was in the event of the Transfiguration that God revealed the true identity of His Son: "This is my beloved Son." Moses and Elijah also appeared there and they were talking to Him. These were the two men of God who had experienced the Divine presence – Moses on Mount Sinai had a glimpse of the divine glory, seeing only the back of God, not his face (Cfr. Exod 33:20), and Elijah experienced the presence of God "in a gentle breeze", the tenderness of God overwhelming him (Cfr. 1 Kgs 19:11-12). If the Transfiguration was an important event for the apostles just like the experience of God's powerful presence in the life of Moses and Elijah, it should be the same for us as well. We need to experience His powerful presence or have a glimpse of something of the glory of God in our lives. For this we need to be at the feet of the Lord, listening to Him, as Mary of Bethany did. We need to listen to the word of God and treasure it in our hearts and ponder over it as the Virgin Mary, our Blessed Mother did. We need to sit with her, the Mother of Jesus, and pray like the apostles for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us. Then we shall be strengthened by the action of God no matter what life offers us or has in store for us; we shall

never be discouraged, we shall never abandon the Lord. On the contrary, we shall always be faithful to Jesus our Lord and surrender ourselves to His plan for our lives just as He did to His Father's plan for Him. And, as we heard in the First Reading, we will be able to do as Abraham did – leaving everything and his own homeland Abraham set out on a journey with nothing but the assurance of a blessing on the basis of God's promise. He was ready to risk his future on the basis of this promise because he knew and believed God was with him. God did work miracles in Abraham's life: God made him father of a great nation and made him a blessing to all nations. May this time of Lent help us to transform ourselves and to become what the Lord desires us to be.
