LITURGY AND WORD

Sin and sickness

The disciples of Jesus want to know from their Master the relationship between sin and sickness. In responding to the disciples, Jesus disassociates sickness from sin. By this disassociation, Jesus wants to liberate people from their narrow, prejudiced and superstitious mentality, and exhorts them not to make God a God of punishment. God is always on the side of life. The concrete expression of God being on the side of life is the incarnation of Jesus. Jesus came so that we may have life and live in its fullness (Jn 10:10).

Gospels never portray sickness as a result of sin but as opportunity where God reveals his compassion and love. But it is good to reflect if there is any relationship between the two realities of life: sin and sickness. What is sin? Sin is a reality that takes us away from God who is the source of happiness and wholeness. When we go away from God due to sin, we lose our wholeness and we become 'sick'. Hence, we must remain with God and experience wholeness in life.

Jesus is the light of the world The healing of the blind man represents the coming of light into the world. The three-fold activities of teaching, preaching and healing of Jesus removes the darkness of ignorance, unbelief and sickness. The Gospel today portrays two kinds of responses to the appearance of light. The first response is that of unbelief; despite the repeated affirmation by the blind man that it was Jesus who healed him, despite the confirmation from the part of the parents that he was their son born blind, the Jews refused to believe in Jesus and his divine origin. On the other hand, the man who was healed believes in Jesus. He becomes a disciple of Jesus. While unbelief leads to darkness, faith leads to life because those who believe in Jesus will not perish, but will have eternal life (Jn 3:16).

Growth of faith

It is useful to note the growth of obstinacy in the Pharisees and the growth of faith in the man healed by Jesus. The Pharisees, at first, seem to accept the fact of the healing miracle. In the second instance, they deny even the fact of a miracle and insist that the parents to deny that their son was born blind. In the final stage, the Pharisees lose interest in finding the truth at all. In the case of the man born blind, he confesses that Jesus healed him; he acknowledges Jesus as a prophet and finally he defends Jesus as the one coming from God. The two responses indicate how one's faith can grow and how it can be lost. While acts of faith increase our faith, the simple doubts and denial of faith lead to loss of faith. Hence, amidst difficulties and struggles, like the blind man who stood firm in his faith, let us also remain steadfast in our faith in Jesus.
