INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34a, 37 - 43

Peter preached about Jesus, baptism, the anointing with the Holy Spirit, works of kindness and healing, and His crucifixion and resurrection from the dead. •All who believe in him are forgiven.

SECOND READING: Colossians 3:1 - 4

Think about what is above. When Christ appears, then you shall appear with •Him in glory.

GOSPEL READING: John 20:1 - 9

Mary Magdalene and the disciples went to the tomb and found it empty. They did not yet understand that Jesus would rise from the dead. Our scripture readings today are all from the New Testament and they all testify to the resurrection of Jesus. In Acts of the Apostles, Peter recounts Jesus' earthly ministry and concluded with the commissioning of the disciples. This reading fills out the meaning of our gospel story today, which offers an empty tomb and a glimpse of hope. What does it mean to you that Jesus Christ had to •rise from the dead?



Today the Church is celebrating the highest solemnity of Christian faith, namely, the belief in the resurrection of Jesus. The first and the second readings of today's solemnity show how this belief was at the core of the faith of the early Church (Acts 10:34, 37-43; Col 3:1-4). Biblical theology believes in two proofs of the Resurrection of Jesus: the empty tomb and the apparitions of the risen Lord. The proof of the empty tomb is not strong enough without the apparitions of the Risen Lord. Today's Gospel reading (Jn 20:1 9) provides us with three responses to the empty tomb. a) The first response is by Mary of Magdala: Her seeing of the empty tomb (that the stone was rolled away) was more physical (Greek: blepo) than spiritual. Therefore she feared that the body of Jesus was displaced. Her act of informing Peter and the Beloved Disciple connotes the sense of obedience to the authority. The running of the two disciples together is symbolic of curiosity. But this curiosity is overcome by the sense of hierarchy. There are two types of hierarchy here: the hierarchy of authority and hierarchy of love. The fact that the Beloved Disciple overruns Peter and yet waits for Peter to enter the tomb first signifies that the hierarchy of love does not compete with the hierarchy of authority. b) The second response is by Peter: Peter's seeing (Greek: theoreo) was more analytical than physical. He analyzes how the clothes of Jesus were lying, how the handkerchief which was wrapped around his head was folded and was lying in a corner, etc. This made him curious about the whole thing but this analysis was not enough for Peter to believe that Jesus was truly risen from the dead. c) The third response is by the Beloved Disciple: The climax of seeing is achieved by the Beloved Disciple. He saw (Greek: horao) and believed, which means his seeing is more spiritual than either physical or analytical. How do I look at the fact of the resurrection of Jesus? In what way do I need to change my way of looking at the mystery of Easter?
