INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 8:2 - 3, 14b - 16a

Moses tells the people that it was the Lord who led them in the wilderness for forty years in order to test them and know what was in their heart.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 10:16 - 17

While speaking about Christians associating themselves with heathen worship which cannot go along with Christian worship, Paul brings in the theme of the Eucharist. The Eucharist is a sharing in the body and blood of Christ.

GOSPEL READING: John 6:51 - 58

The repeated Jewish objection that Jesus cannot give them his flesh to eat is countered by restating the necessity of eating his flesh and drinking his blood as the condition for having eternal life.

*God was with his people on their journey, nourishing them with manna and *water. How does God respond to your needs on your journey? What is different *about the food God gave the people in the desert and the food he gives us?

LITURGY AND WORD Blessed Alexandrina Maria da Costa of

Balasar, Portugal (1904–1955), at the age of 14, in order to escape an attack by three men and to safeguard her purity jumped from the window, injuring her spine irreparably. Since then she was bedridden and suffered a progressively increasing paralysis, for the rest of her 30 years of life. Yet, she did not despair, but entrusted herself to Jesus with these words: "As you are a prisoner in the tabernacle and I am a prisoner on my bed for doing Your will, so we can keep ourselves company." As a result, she began to live through ever more powerful mystical experiences, and from Friday 3 October, 1938 until 24 March, 1942, up to 182 times, she relived the sufferings of the Passion. During one of her mystical experiences Jesus told her "Keep me company in the Blessed Sacrament. remain in the tabernacle night and day, waiting to give my love and grace to all who would visit me. But so few come. I am so abandoned, so lonely, so offended.. Many...do not believe in my existence; they do not believe that I am present in the tabernacle. They curse me. Others believe, but do not love me and do not visit me; they live as if I were not there... You have chosen to love me in the tabernacles where you can contemplate me, not with the eyes of the body, but those of the soul. I am truly present there as in Heaven, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity." During the Holy Week of 1942 Jesus said to her, "You will not take food again on earth. Your food will be my Flesh; your drink will be my Divine Blood." On Good Friday 1942 she began an absolute fast which lasted for more than thirteen years until her death. The only nourishment which she received was Jesus n Holy Communion every morning. On 13 October, 1955, on the anniversary of he last apparition of the Blessed Mother at Fatima, Alexandrina was called home for her eternal reward.

For today's world it is irrational and stupid to think that bread and wine will change to become the body and blood of Jesus. It is equally irrational and stupid to think a human person can survive for thirteen years only being nourished by the Holy Communion. We live in a society that believes and relies less on God and more on human accomplishments and talents. Though today's society wants the bread multiplied by Jesus it does not want anything to do with Jesus the real bread. People desire eternal life and yet vehemently seek to come away from the cross and do not want to feed on the body and blood of Jesus.

In today's gospel Jesus tells us, "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." Many

were attracted to Jesus because he offered them something irresistible: the deaf heard, the dumb spoke, the lepers cleansed, the dead were raised, the hungry were fed, etc. In spite of these signs and wonders they witnessed, many stumbled and left him at his invitation to eat his body and drink his blood. Without receiving the very life of God offered in Jesus there is no life in us. Apparently though Jesus requirement is "hard" there is no alternative available to us to possess the eternal life he offers us. Jesus offers a new relationship with God when we receive his body and blood as our true food and drink leading us to eternal life. Eternal life is to remain in Jesus and to have Jesus remain in us. The once-for-all sacrifice of Christ is the pouring out of his life for the life of the world, bringing forgiveness and a new power of life. That sacrifice also shows us the deepest reality about God-his love-and about life: all true life is sacrificial. At Eucharist we receive into ourselves, into our bodies and souls, the life-giving power of God, and precisely by eating and drinking we proclaim the Lord's once-for-all death until he comes (1 Cor 11:26). Let us pray: "Lord, you alone can satisfy the deepest longing and hunger in our hearts. May I always hunger for the imperishable bread, that I may be satisfied in you alone as the True Bread of Heaven. Nourish and strengthen me that I may serve you with great joy, generosity and zeal all the days of my life.'
