FIRST READING: Wisdom 6:12 - 16

*Wisdom is there for those who love and seek her: resplendent, unfading, responsive, eager, patient, perfect, gracious and caring.

SECOND READING: 1 Thessalonians 4:13 - 18

Those who have died in Christ will rise first. Believers will be with Christ forever. Christians can comfort one another with this knowledge.

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 25:1 - 13

Jesus told the disciples the parable of the bridesmaid, emphasizing the urgency of keeping alert to the coming of God's reign: "Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

In the holy scriptures that we hear proclaimed today, wisdom is presented as a central value. We hear an ode to wisdom in the first reading, and the parable of the wise and foolish virgins in the Gospel. This wisdom that we need will enable us to be ready for the coming of the Lord. Listening to these readings, what do you think you need to do to prepare for the Lord's coming today?

LITURGY AND WORD

According to an ancient legend a sparrow was taking a few drops of water in its beak and dropping them on the house which was on fire. A man was wondering as to what is the use of these few drops. They get consumed by the fire let alone putting the fire off. So he spoke to the sparrow whose reply was quite thought provoking. The sparrow said, "I am also aware of the fact that the few drops which I put on the fire will not put the fire off. But tonight when I will return to my nest I will have the satisfaction of knowing the fact in my heart that I was not on the side of those who set the fire but on the side of those put the fire off." The point is not what you do but with what purpose you

do something. As we come to the end of the liturgical year the Mother Church instructs us as to how one should be prepared to meet the Lord with the noble purpose. We can summarize all the readings of today (Wis 6:12-16; 1 Thess 4:13-16 or 4:13-14; Mt 25:1-13) in one word: Wisdom. Wisdom suggests a noble purpose essential for preparing oneself to meet the Lord. This wisdom way is based on practical knowledge based on experience and observation. Today's Gospel passage is taken from the last of the five Discourses of Jesus recorded by St Matthew, namely the Eschatological or Endtime Discourse (chapters 24-25). We make three observations about the wise virgins in today's Gospel: a) The wise virgins were very practical in taking extra oil with them when they went to meet the bridegroom whereas the foolish ones did not care to do so. When the purpose is noble you are well prepared to walk an extra mile. One has to keep some space between one's personal plans and the plan of God. Man plans according to chronos (time which is measurable) but God plans with kairos (opportune time). The return of the Lord will not take place in chronos but in kairos. Hence one has to be practical and carry some extra oil of wisdom in order to be ready to meet the Lord at any hour, even in the midnight. b) They were foresighted and strove to be self-sufficient. A short-sighted and over-dependent person can land in trouble as the foolish virgins did.

c) The wise virgins were prudent enough not to be affected by the mistake made by the foolishness of the other virgins. They were firm in going ahead with the noble task in mind and left the foolish virgins to handle their own problems.

In what way can we use our wisdom to discern the noble task in store for us? How can we overcome the obstacle of our selfish ambitions in order to carry out this noble task with a noble purpose?
