

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Isaiah 63:16b - 17, 19b; 64:2 - 7

Isaiah prophesied, "All our good deeds are like polluted rags; we have all withered like leaves ... We are the clay and you are the potter: we are the work of your hands."

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:3 - 9

Paul wrote, "God is faithful, and by Him you were called to fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. You are not lacking in any spiritual gifts as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ."

GOSPEL READING: Mark 13:33 - 37

Jesus said, "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come ... Watch, therefore" whether at sunset, midnight, cock crow, or sunrise.

"Watch!"

We hear a lot about waiting today. With the Chosen People in exile, Isaiah humbly prays for God's saving presence. Feeling abandoned, the psalmist sings, "Let us see your face and we shall be saved. "St Paul assures the Christians in Corinth that they have what they need from God as they wait for Christ's coming in glory. Finally, in Mark's Gospel, Jesus advises His disciples to be on the watch, like servants waiting for their master to return.

LITURGY AND WORD

With the beginning of the season of advent we begin a new liturgical year. The term "advent" is an anglicized version of the Latin word "adventus," meaning "coming." Advent is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas.

The first reading of today contains the lament of the Israelites in despair as they return from exile. The exiles who return to their homeland after the exile do not find the conditions favorable for their settling down. They face much hostility from the Jews and the Gentiles who live in that area. It is at this juncture that Third Isaiah comes to them with a message of renewed hope. The exiles think that God is still angry with them. That is why they ask God, their Father and redeemer, to rend the heavens and come down. They also acknowledge their sins, "Behold, we have sinned; in our sins we have been a long time." They also ask the crucial question, "Will we be saved?" Of course, God saves his people, but the final act of God's saving does not happen during the lifetime of the people who cry to him. The generation that returns from exile with the hope of finding acceptance in their homeland, in fact face much adversity. Their cry reaches God, but it takes another five hundred years for God to send his Son to redeem the people. This fact takes us back to the theme of Advent, which is waiting in expectation. God the Father's sending his Son into the world is a historical event that will take place much later. Jesus' coming has a precise purpose: turning the minds and hearts of the people back to God. But his life and mission is not a cakewalk. He has to die in order to win friends for God. The theme of waiting in expectation comes into sharp focus in the gospel of today. Through the parable of the doorkeeper Jesus calls our attention to vigilance. Jesus speaks of a man who going on a journey after having entrusted his house to his servants warned the doorkeeper to keep watch. Obviously, he did not reveal the time of his return. His coming could be in the evening, or in midnight, or at cock-crow, or in the morning. According to Jewish reckoning of time, the first watch begins around 6:00 p.m., the second at 9:00 p.m., the third at mid-night, and the fourth around 3:00 a.m. The watchman at the time of Jesus, as is today, is a paid employee and his duty is to watch. He should not be found sleeping during working hours. As with other

parables, this parable also contains a lesson. This is an eye-opener for us as we begin the new liturgical year. We can never let ourselves fall into slumber or lose sight of our goal which is union with Christ our Lord.

On 3rd August 2016 a bridge on the Goa Mumbai highway collapsed on account of which two buses and a couple of four wheelers and two wheelers plunged into the surging Savitri river at the middle of the night. The drivers could not see the collapsed bridge as it was night. Accidents like this do happen on a regular basis and lives are lost. Physical lives may be lost due to natural or accidental causes which are painful enough, but losing eternal life is the biggest tragedy. It is here that our faith comes to our rescue. God saves us, but we must cooperate with God. During this season of Advent let us dedicate our lives to God so that he can save us.
