

LITURGY AND WORD

Today is the fourth and final Sunday of Advent. Christmas has come very near, in fact, we will come together again within a few hours to celebrate the birthday of Jesus. There is no gap between the fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas this year. On this Sunday the Liturgy of the Word invites us to reflect on two messages: a) God is great and, b) he wants to make his people great. The Liturgy of the Word revolves around two promises: promises made to David and to Mary. In the former, the initiative to build the Temple comes from David, but does not find acceptance by God. In the latter the initiative comes from God and Mary gives her full consent.

Both these promises have epoch-making consequences. David has been king for about thirty-eight years (1000–962) B.C.). Despite the failures of David, God promises that he will have a long reign and his dynasty will be firmly established, and that the Messiah will come from his dynasty. After a thousand years, the promise made to David

was fulfilled. The gospel of today depicts God sending his angel to Mary. Fear grips Mary and so the angel has to calm her down. The message is that the Child Mary will conceive is a descendant of David and his kingdom will have no end. On Mary's further query the angel reveals the most important part of the revelation that the child will be conceived in Mary by the power of God. David proposes to build a Temple and the proposal is welcomed by the prophet Nathan. Through Nathan, however, God promptly turns the offer down. Instead God will build a house or dynasty for David. David's offspring will build the Temple. He may be punished, but he will not be rejected as Saul was. David's dynasty will be established forever (2 Sam 7:16). The passage discusses the future of the Jerusalem sanctuary and of the Davidic monarchy-the two institutions which are vital to the people of Israel for several centuries after David. Through the prophet Nathan, God makes firm promises to David about both these things. All these promises, as God fulfils them, would make David's name great. Without question, David has been Israel's greatest king and his reputation stands for all time as one of the greatest men of history. However, his God-given greatness is not for his own benefit and

glory, but for the benefit of the nation

he rules. These plans depend on the ful-

fillment of God's promise to send a Son

of David, the Messiah, who will be the one finally to bring God's people the security and peace they always need. At this juncture we pose a question: what do we do to win God's favor? We need not go too far to find an answer for today's gospel provides it. The answer is found in the words the angel speaks to Mary: "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." In order to be accepted by God we have to find his favor. David could not find favor because of his excessive warfare and human frailties. Mary, the humble maiden of Nazareth is pure and immaculate and remains as such throughout her life. Ever since she has said "Yes" to God she remains the unchallenged reservoir of God's grace for the millions of people who turn to her. By living our lives in close association with Mary we too can become the favored ones of God. As we are approaching the celebration of Christmas in which Mary plays the pivotal role, let us prepare ourselves to receive the Lord Jesus who comes to save us.
