INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY! FIRST READING: Exodus 20:1 - 17

•God delivered the commandments to Moses and the Hebrews, who had been •freed from slavery in Egypt. "You shall not have other gods besides me," said •the Lord God.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:22 - 25

*Paul preached Christ crucified "a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles." God's folly is wiser and His weakness stronger than human wisdom.

GOSPEL READING: John 2:13 - 25

Jesus found people buying and selling in the temple. With a whip he drove out the moneychangers. He said, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up."

Last week we heard God speak to Peter, James and John from the mountain where Jesus was transfigured. Today God speaks to Moses from another holy mountain. But we are challenged not to misunderstand. Jesus was misunderstood when He assured the temple authorities that He could raise it up in three days. This promise will be used against Him when He is on trial. But as Christians, we know, as did Paul, that the wisdom of God is beyond all human wisdom.

LITURGY AND WORD

The Ten Commandments are a collection of biblical laws contained in Exodus 20:1-17 which literally means "Ten Words." The Bible places the origin of the Ten Commandments within the time of Moses. According to Exodus, God gave the commandments to the Israelites when they were encamped near Mount Sinai after the exodus from Egypt. Brief explanation for each of the commandments is presented below.

The First Commandment. The First Commandment defines the relationship between God and Israel by categorically eliminating all other deities from

Commandment defines the relationship between God and Israel by categorically eliminating all other deities from Israel's allegiance. It bans the worship of foreign gods. The Commandment requires faith in him as the one and only God.

The Second Commandment. This commandment bans any image of the deity carved from wood, stone or metal. Whereas virtually all other contemporary cultures used cultic representations as a means of entering into contact with the deity, Israelites were not to do so. At issue was the fact that God cannot be controlled by humans. This commandment seems to have been primarily cited as a prohibition of false oaths. Israelites ought not to try to manipulate God by an abusive use of his name.

The Third Commandment. This commandment enjoins the observance of the Lord's Day. For both physical and religious reasons, one day of rest in every seven days is a necessity. A weekly day of rest serves man's physical and spiritual welfare simultaneously. Christians observe Sunday as the day of rest because the Lord rose on Easter Sunday.

The Fourth Commandment. Here we have a prescription requiring grown-up adults to provide care and support for the elderly. If any nation abandons respect for the mystery, dignity and authority of parenthood, before long the moral fibre and social fabric of that nation are bound to disintegrate.

The Fifth Commandment. The com-

The Fifth Commandment. The commandment is a prohibition of murder. It forbids the illegal or wilful killing of the innocents. A man's life is his utterly indispensable and precious possession; but, more than that, man is God's image-bearer, and murder wantonly destroys God's image. Hence capital punishment is the penalty affixed to the breaking of this law (Gen 9:5-6).

LITURGY AND WORD CONT'D

The Sixth Commandment. This commandment forbade male Israelites to have sexual intercourse with the wife of another Israelite. Sexual intercourse between an Israelite man, albeit married, and an unmarried and unbetrothed woman was not considered to be the crime of adultery. Adultery is a serious matter and in our day we are beginning to see what happens when the home is undermined by marital infidelity.

The Seventh Commandment. Here is a

prohibition of theft in any and all forms. Property is essentially an extension of a man's personality, and thus this law indicates that the rights and the achievements of one's neighbour must be respected. *The Eighth Commandment*. The commandment forbids false witness in a legal proceeding. Protection is extended not only to the Israelite but to the "neighbour," that is, the co-inhabitants of the same land. Truth is the quality that the community should possess without which no interpersonal relationship can be built.

The Ninth Commandment. This commandment forbids the protracted appropriation of another's wife rather than individual acts of adultery.

The Tenth Commandment. With regard to goods, the commandment forbids not only robbery but all illegal acquisition of another's property. The tenth commandment highlights hidden motives that people keep nurturing and from which emerge wrong appetites and intentions. It agrees with Paul that covetousness is idolatry (Col 3:5), since inordinate craving means that man's ego has become man's god.
