#### INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

#### FIRST READING: Acts 10:25 - 26, 34 - 35, 44 - 48

Peter entered the house of Cornelius and proclaimed the good news to his household. They listened and believed, so Peter had them baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

#### SECOND READING: 1 John 4:7 - 10

\*John wrote, "Let us love one another, because love is of God." The person without love knows nothing of God because God is love.

#### GOSPEL READING: John 15:1 - 8

Jesus told His disciples, "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you." There is no greater love than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends."

Today the focus of the readings is on others. Peter preached to the Gentiles, people outside the Jewish community, and was surprised that the Holy Spirit came to them as well. John writes that we are to love one another as God loves us. In the Gospel, Jesus challenges His disciples to love one another as He love them, that is, with a self-sacrificing love. This, truly, is the love that we are called to have for others.

Catholics observe a Eucharistic fast of one hour prior to receiving communion. Therefore, it is inappropriate to have any food, candy, gum, etc., in your mouth while in church.

It doesn't matter how many Sundays you sit in church or if you think you are saved. God sees what you do and how you treat others. That is what really matters. Amen.

#### LITURGY AND WORD

The First Reading contains excerpts from a lengthy speech delivered by Peter in the house of Cornelius, the first high profile Roman official to be converted. It is time for Christianity to leave its Jewish matrix and invite the Gentiles into its fold. It is not surprising that the Gentile Mission is inaugurated by Peter as he is the head of the apostolic college although it would be Paul who would unravel the fullest extent of the Gentile Mission. Although the episode occupies a significant place in Acts, Luke conveys little information about the man himself. At the beginning of the Cornelius narrative, Luke notes that Cornelius resides in Caesarea and describes him as "a centurion of the Italian cohort, a devout man who feared God with all his household, gave alms liberally to the people, and prayed constantly to God (Acts 10:1-2). Luke emphasizes that Cornelius is a religious man. Together with his entire household Cornelius fears God. He is charitable towards the people and he prays to God without ceasing. While Cornelius is a Gentile, Luke takes care to introduce him as an exceptionally good and pious Gentile whose conversion almost becomes a reward for honest and God-fearing life. Indeed, the angel who appears to him and instructs him to send for Peter says that Cornelius' behaviour has become a memorial before God. (Acts 10:4) In Peter's activity in Caesarea the mission to the Gentiles is thus formally inaugurated. For the Lucan story it is important that Peter, the spokesman of the early Christian community, be seen in this role. 'God shows no partiality' (10:34), so

"God shows no partiality" (10:34), so Peter proclaims. God calls both Jews and non-Jews to salvation through Jesus Christ, respecting all human beings, from any nation whose lives are upright. All can thus find acceptance in the sight of God, who has sent the Word of salvation to all through Jesus Christ, who was put to death on the cross but raised now to his Father's glory. In God's design Jesus has been sent to bring forgiveness of sins to all who are willing to accept him and put faith in "his name" (10:43). Cornelius and his household become people who welcome this message.

The Second Reading says that God is love. We know this not because of our initiative of loving God, but because God took the initiative of sending the only Son into the world so that we might have life and that sins might be expiated.

#### LITURGY AND WORD Cont'd

The initiative comes from God. The author never forgets the obligation Christians have, i.e., they ought to love one another. God is the one who loves us first. Sending his Son into the world is an example of God's love.

In the Gospel Jesus says, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13). That is what Jesus has done by dying on the cross for the sake of his own. Jesus is like a loving mother who is willing to die during delivery in order to save her child from death and give it life. Abiding in Jesus' love will be possible for the disciples only if they keep his commandments just as he has kept his Father's commandments and abides in his love (Jn 15:10). Here the 'commandments' are not understood as some external laws imposed from outside but as the expression of the wish/will of the one who loves and is loved. Just as Jesus, the beloved Son of God, who is constantly attuned to the Father's will, finds joy in accomplishing it, so the disciples by lovingly turning their will to Jesus' will and obeying his commandments will be able to remain in his love. In short, loving obedience is the condition for abiding in Jesus' love. Christ-like love means being ready and willing to lay down our lives for one another as friends in the Lord. This sort of love is the only commandment and the last testament of Jesus, the 'lover,' who has walked the path of love.
