

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

LITURGY AND WORD

Of the many feasts that the Jewish people celebrated only two have entered the Christian liturgical calendar, namely, the Passover and the Pentecost. Other feasts like the Feast of Tents – Tabernacles. Feast of Hanukkah – Dedication or the Feast of Purim have not found entry into the group of Christian festivals. The feast of Pentecost or the Feast of Weeks was the second of the three great Jewish feasts. Its name signified that it concluded the period of seven weeks which began with the presentation of the first sheaf of the barley harvest during the Passover celebration. Originally, the festival was the time when, with appropriate rituals and ceremony, the first fruits of the corn harvest, the last Palestinian crop to ripen, were formally dedicated. In later Jewish times, the feast developed into a commemoration of the giving of the Mosaic Law. To reinforce this function, the rabbis taught that the Law was given fifty days after the Exodus, a tradition of which there is no trace in the Old Testament, or in the Jewish authorities, like Philo and Josephus. Thus it remains an agricultural feast marking the end of the grain harvest and was celebrated during the month of Sivan (May/

According to the Acts of the Apostles, the apostles remained in Jerusalem after the Resurrection appearances. On the day of Pentecost they were gathered in one house when the Holy Spirit came upon them, sounding like a mighty wind and appearing like tongues of fire upon each of them. Then the apostles began to speak in foreign languages, attracting the attention of foreign Jews who were amazed to hear their native languages spoken by the Galileans. This set the stage for Peter's sermon which resulted in the conversion and baptism of about 3000 people (Acts 2:1-47). Like all harvest feasts, it was a joyful occasion. After the death and resurrection of Jesus, the stage was set for the dissemination of the saving message of Jesus. At the time of the ascension Jesus had given his disciples the clear mandate,

"Go into all the world and preach the Gospel to the whole creation." Jesus had also urged his disciples not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father. The promise of the Father for which Jesus wanted his disciples to wait in Jerusalem was the gift of the Holy Spirit.

God always works with a plan. The harvest feast of Pentecost provided the ideal setting for the public manifestation of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. For the major festivals like the Passover and the Pentecost Jewish pilgrims gathered in Jerusalem. The first reading of today mentions Jewish pilgrims in Jerusalem from at least 15 nations. There is no denying the fact that the outpouring of the Spirit became a universal experience given the number of nations from which people were present in Jerusalem when the miracle occurred.

The feast of Pentecost brings to an end the Easter season. We have spent about 100 days of special grace. The season of Lent led us to Easter and the Easter season led us to the Pentecost. We are well equipped to take our journey ahead as the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit provide us assistance. The Holy Trinity is the power behind every Christian life: family, community and missionary. St Paul says that even to pray we need the help of God.
