# <u>INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!</u> FIRST READING: Genesis 3:9 - 15

The Lord God told Adam he disobeyed. Adam blamed the woman, and the woman blamed the serpent. The Lord God then put enmity between the serpent and the woman.

#### SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 4:13 - 5:1

We believe that God who raises up the Lord Jesus will raise us up too. We know that when the earthly tent in which we dwell is destroyed we have a dwelling provided for us by God.

#### GOSPEL READING: Mark 3:20 - 35

Jesus asked, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" He continued, "These are my mother and my brothers. Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me."

Most of the Gospel readings during Ordinary Time this year are taken from the Gospel of St. Mark. Mark wrote his Gospel as a dramatic story with Jesus at the center. Jesus is always moving, inviting his disciples and us to follow. Mark wanted those who heard or read his Gospel to come to understand Jesus and recognize him as the Son of God. As is typical, Jesus moves quickly through a growing crowd in today's Gospel, rebuking those who misunderstand his power, warning those who blaspheme against the Holy Spirit, and redefining their understanding of family.

#### LITURGY AND WORD

The theme of today's Liturgy is sin. What is sin? Sin is an offence against reason, truth, and right conscience; it is failure in genuine love for God and neighbour caused by a perverse attachment to certain goods. It wounds the nature of man and injures human solidarity. It has been defined as "an utterance, a deed, or a desire contrary to the eternal law."

The Book of Genesis reveals that the first parents were created by God without sin but they chose to act contrary to his revealed will and thereby caused sin to become an endemic feature of human existence (Gen 3). Sin is revolt against the holiness and sovereign will of God. Therefore, it is both a condition of the heart/mind/will (Isa 29:13) and the practical outworking of that condition in thoughts, words, and deeds that offend God and transgress his holy law (Gen 6:5). For Israel, sin was a failure to keep the conditions of the covenant that the Lord had graciously made with the people on Sinai (Exod

The first reading from the book of Genesis teaches that sin is caused by disobedience. The first parents could not continue in the blissful situation in which they were placed. Their greed for power and their longing to be like God brought about their downfall. The gospel of today deals with a very strong accusation made by the Jewish scribes: that Jesus is possessed by Beelzebul and casts out demons by the prince of demons. Jesus poses a question to them: "How can Satan cast out Satan?" The question implies that if Satan suffers internal division, his reign is at an end.

This section then concludes with an implicit charge against his accusers that by denying the power of God at work in Jesus they are sinning against the Holy Spirit. Jesus is truly the stronger one whose proclamation of the imminence of the kingdom inaugurates a conflict of kingdoms between God and God's adversary Satan, whose reign is collapsing.

The seriousness of the conflict is manifested by Jesus' counter charge that his accusers are committing the sin of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. By attributing the liberating and healing activity of Jesus to the world of Satan the scribes are committing the ultimate insult to God.

The "unforgivable sin" has been interpreted in various ways throughout Church history. Augustine exercised a major influence by describing it as final

impenitence and resistance to God's grace. In medieval theology it is a genus containing six species of sin: despair, presumption, impenitence, obstinacy, resisting divine truth known as such, and envy of another's spiritual welfare. Contemporary Catholic doctrine continues the Augustinian tradition by describing it as deliberate refusal to accept God's mercy by repenting (cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 1864).

There is no person in Israel or the whole world who is not a sinner. However, those who have a right relationship with God, receive his forgiveness and walk in his ways are sometimes described as righteous (Gen 6:9) and blameless (Job 1:1). This is not because they are free from sin, but because the true direction of their lives is to serve and please God in the way he requires. Sin was punished by God in various ways, e.g., exile from the Promised Land, but the final punishment for individual sin and wickedness was death – "You shall die" (Gen 2;17; Ps 73:27). This is certainly physical death, but is also spiritual death, being cut off from communion with the Living God.

According to Mark the "unforgivable sin" is not the final impenitence or refusal to accept doctrine, but a deliberate choice to interpret the presence of divine action as evil. To say that Jesus has an unclean Spirit by the learned Scribes who have the knowledge of Jesus' actions is a deliberate attempt to malign him. Jesus is the Son of God and God's power is at work in him. To deny it is to deny the Holy Spirit which becomes the "unpardonable sin."
