

31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

<u>INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!</u> *FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 6:2 - 6*

Moses told the people they must follow God's law. Above all they must know that the Lord alone is God, and they must love the Lord with all their heart, soul and strength.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 7:23 - 28

Before Jesus, all the priests died and had to be replaced, but, "because He remains forever," His priesthood does not pass away. Jesus saves "those who approach God through Him."

GOSPEL READING: Mark 12:28b - 34

The greatest command is this: Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. We hear the same words today in the first reading and the Gospel. They must be important! In Deuteronomy the words are put in the mouth of Moses: Love God with your entire being. In Mark, Jesus repeats these words in answering the faithful scribe. But then he goes further, quoting Leviticus: Love your neighbor as yourself. As we listen to the readings today, we reflect on how well we keep these most important commandments.

NOTE: The reception of Holy Communion, in Catholic teaching, indicates an agreement of faith, on the recipient's part, with the Catholic doctrine of Jesus' real presence in this sacrament. Catholics observe a Eucharistic fast of one hour prior to receiving communion. Therefore, it is inappropriate to have any food, candy, gum, etc., in your mouth while in church.

Having shared in the Eucharist, you are compelled to go and work for peace and justice, thereby building God's Kingdom now.

LITURGY AND WORD

For a short introduction to the Book of Deuteronomy see the reflection on the First Sunday of Lent. The Old Testament contains 613 precepts of the Law. It was common among the Jewish scholars at the time of Jesus to dispute among themselves as to which was the greatest commandment as we see in today's gospel.

To the scribe who put to Jesus the question about the greatest commandment, Jesus quoted Deuteronomy 6:4-5 "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart." The problem is that the heart of man does not always do that.

This passage has become the central prayer in Judaism called the Shema, (Shema means Hear, which is the opening word of the prayer), because it expresses in so few words the most important precepts of the Jewish religion. This prayer is the first principle of thought and the guide for the will in family life and community life. It was with the 'Shema Israel' on their lips that the Israelite martyrs went to the stake and suffered for Israel and their God.

First, the Lord alone is God of Israel. To all intents and purposes he is the only God, since his power extends to all nations. Secondly, it is not enough for God's people simply to go through certain rituals in their life and worship. Rather, they must truly love God, and devote their whole lives to him. The phrase "with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" means the whole person. The biblical idea of heart covers our ideas of the will and the mind. True godliness means that all our abilities, as well as all we possess, are given to God. Only God sees through the heart of the human person. Therefore, only God can judge the human person. He has access to the innermost region of the heart, which is neither under the influence of other human persons nor even at one's own disposition. From a transformed heart come forth faith, hope and love. There is no suggestion in the Bible that the brain is the centre of consciousness, thought or will. It is the heart which is so regarded. "Mind" is perhaps the closest modern term to the biblical use of "heart." The Bible does not distinguish the rational or mental processes n the way that Greek philosophy does.

God knows the heart of each one and is not deceived by outward appearances (1 Sam 16:7). Ezekiel says that a new heart must be the aim of the wicked (18:31); and Jeremiah says that God's Law will be written on the heart (Jer 31-31-34) The heart is regarded as the seat of the affections but also as the seat of the intellect. Coming back to the Gospel, Jesus placed love for God at the heart of the law; love for our neighbour should and will spring naturally from this as a consequence. If we try to put love of neighbour first or, worse still, leave out the love of God altogether, we shall make a shipwreck of our lives and fail even to love our neighbour as we should. On the other hand, if we say that we love God, and do not love our neighbour, we are hypocrites (1 Jn 4:20). Although the teacher agreed that all this was true, and therefore was very near the kingdom of God, he was not yet a member of it as he had not yet acknowledged Jesus as the Saviour. Did he ever do so? The scribe's correct understanding of what is important in the OT Law places him close to the coming kingdom and prepares him to receive it properly.
