## INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY! FIRST READING: Acts 5:12 - 16

\*Through the work of the apostles, many signs and wonders took place among the people. People in great numbers became believers, and many sick people were cured.

#### SECOND READING: Revelation 1:9 - 11a, 12 - 13, 17 - 19

The author of Revelation had a vision of seven gold lamp stands. Among the lamp stands was one like a son of man.

#### GOSPEL READING: John 20:19 - 31

One of the Twelve, Thomas, was absent when the risen Lord first appeared to the others. Later, when Thomas was with them, Jesus came and said, "Bring your hand and put it into my side and ... believe." Thomas cried, "My Lord and my God!"

In today's Gospel, Jesus commissions the disciples, sending them out as His Father had sent Him. We see the fruits of their work in the first reading. The sick are cured, demons are driven out, sins are forgiven, great numbers come to believe. Today's Church can be traced all the way back to this early band of believers, impelled out of the locked room and into the streets of Jerusalem. Where can we bear fruit today?

#### LITURGY AND WORD

#### IST READING: THE SPRINGTIME OF CHRIS-TIANITY

The Acts of the Apostles contains three major summaries (2:42-47; 4:32-35; 5:12-16). These are found in the early chapters of Acts and are somewhat related to each other. These summary statements depict in idyllic or tranquil fashion the springtime of Christianity. In this summary, the miracles of the apostles receive ample mention. It is not just Peter but other apostles as well perform them. The people who bring the sick to the apostles have obviously put their trust in them. Many must have been moved by faith in the Word that the apostles have been preaching. The faith and the good example of the apostles and other Christians have moved people to esteem them highly and put trust in them. Such traits manifest the Christians as a caring community.

#### 2ND READING: THE LIVING LORD

The Book of Revelation is the last book of the Bible and the only book in the NT that is exclusively prophetic in character. It belongs to the class of apocalyptic literature in which the divine message is conveyed by visions and dreams. Revelation contains four great visions. The first vision (1:9—3:22) from which today's reading is taken pictures Christ as the critic of the churches, who commends their virtues and condemns their vices. While the author is in the island of Patmos he is asked to write down his vision and send it to the seven churches. He then sees the vision of the glorified Christ, identified as the Son of Man who is clothed with a long robe and with a golden girdle around his waist and standing amidst the seven golden lampstands. When the Lord speaks he says that he is the living one. The Lord of life is the one who was dead, that is to say, someone very much rooted in human history and its conflicts. The Church is able to confront death valiantly because it s in the hands of the Lord of life.

#### GOSPEL: THOMAS' DOUBT CLEARED

The gospel of today places before us the encounter between Jesus and his disciples. The encounter takes place on Easter Sunday itself and as can be expected the disciples are frightened because their Master has been put to death. Jesus wishes them peace, shows them his hands and side to assure them that he has been raised by his Father. He also confers the Holy Spirit upon them and gives them the power to forgive sins. Next episode involves the apostle Thomas. Thomas, who has not been present when Jesus appears refuses to believe the testimony of the other apostles. He has been adamant to see before he believes. Jesus appears again on the following Sunday and invites Thomas to probe him. Thomas emerges from his doubt and makes a confession of Jesus which will be remembered to his credit for ever. "My Lord and my God" is one of the best Christological confessions recorded in the New Testament.

As today is also the Divine Mercy Sunday, let us pray that the Floodgates of the Divine Mercy from Heaven may be opened and that we may experience God's mercy and forgiveness.
