5TH SUNDAY OF LENT

<u>INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!</u> FIRST READING: Isauah 43:16 - 21

Isaiah recounted how the Lord crushed the enemies of Israel. Then the Lord God did something entirely new by providing water in the desert for His chosen people to drink.

SECOND READING: Philippians 3:8 - 14

Paul told the Philippians how much he had forfeited in order to arrive at resurrection from the dead. Paul's entire attention was on the finish line as he ran toward the prize: life in Christ Jesus.

GOSPEL READING: John 8:1 - 11

Pharisees brought to Jesus a woman caught in adultery. They hoped he would condemn her to death by stoning, but Jesus said simply, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." No one dared. Jesus forgave the woman and told her to avoid sin.

Isaiah rhapsodizes about what God has done for us, providing dry land through the sea and a way through the desert. In the Gospel, Jesus finds a way to save the adulterous woman's life, then forgives her for the path she had taken. St. Paul attests that in Christ he has found the only way that matters. As we listen to today's readings, let us examine the path we are on in our own lives.

LITURGY AND WORD

IST READING: SOMETHING NEW IS IN THE OFFING

Prophet Isaiah enumerates the works of the Lord in the first exodus as he brings a new message from God. The events brought to the attention of the people are the marvellous signs he did as the people crossed the Red Sea, such as parting the mighty waters, letting the horses and the chariots of the Egyptians enter the sea and getting perished there as the waters return on them with mighty force. The message that he brings to the people is that God is going to do something new and goes on to describe a number of symbolic things: he will make a way in the wilderness and make water flow in the desert whose waters the wild animals can drink and honour God. God also says that he will provide drinking water in the desert for his chosen people. When we read this prophecy in the season of Lent there is nothing to doubt that the newness that God promises is the salvation he brings through his Son Jesus through his suffering and death.

2ND READING: CHRIST STANDS ABOVE ALL ELSE

In a moving passage Paul writes about a number of events from his personal life after his encounter with Christ. He now considers all that was advantageous to him earlier as rubbish. The knowledge of Christ is superior to everything else. After this Paul goes on to explain that we gain acceptance before God by faith and not through the works of the law. Faith in Christ is the measure through which we establish our relationship with God. Speaking about perfection Paul insists that he has not yet reached perfection, expressing this idea through the metaphor of a race in a stadium. He has not yet reached the goal. The goal Paul desires and struggles to reach is the full and final possession of Christ.

GOSPEL: HELPLESS WOMAN RESCUED

The story of the woman caught in adultery is a supreme example of Jesus' attitude towards sinners. It is a famous story. The Jewish opponents bring before Jesus, a woman whom they say is caught in the act of committing adultery in order to test him. They know that the punishment for such a crime is death by stoning. In a situation of considerable distress, half-clad, and aware that she is facing death, the

woman is of no concern to the Scribes and the Pharisees. They accuse her and challenge Jesus. They are not interested in either the fate of the woman or the husband who is never mentioned, but in the possibility of finding fault with Jesus. She is being made an instrument for the purposes of the Scribes and the Pharisees "that they might have some charge to bring against him."

As the Scribes and the Pharisees continue to ask him, Jesus gives them the answer, "Let him who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." As they hear this, the Scribes and the Pharisees drift away, one by one. Nothing is said of the people. They also may have departed, leaving Jesus alone with the woman. None of them can lay claim to be without sin. Jesus then dismisses the woman telling her to go and not to sin again. The command to sin no more offers her the possibility of a newness of life in a right relationship with God. What we see in this episode is Jesus' ability to handle tough situations. The Pharisees who bring the woman are tense, but Jesus is calm and relaxed throughout; he accepts the woman openly and lovingly, as an adult and as a person. He has a sureness of touch; he can handle the situation and the relationship with her because he has nothing to be afraid of in himself. Jesus is a totally integrated person: spiritually and emotionally.
