INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Acts 13:14, 43 - 52

Paul and Barnabas traveled to Antioch where they entered the synagogue to teach. Some Jews became their followers while others expelled them from the town. "So they shook dust from their feet" and went on to Iconium.

SECOND READING: Revelation 7:9, 14b - 17

The author of Revelation had a vision of a large crowd of people from every nation and race, dressed in white robes and holding palm branches, standing before the Lamb.

GOSPEL READING: John 10:27 - 30

"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life ... No one can take them out of my hand. My Father ... is greater than all ... The Father and I are one."

The mission of the early church comes to a pivotal juncture today: Paul and Barnabas begin to preach to the Gentiles. If they are to "be instrument(s) of salvation to the ends of the earth," they must reach out beyond the synagogues. After all, the Good Shepherd, as Jesus is portrayed in today's Gospel, gathers all to Himself. Indeed, all of us "are His people, the sheep of His flock."

LITURGY AND WORD

1ST READING: ***THE FIRST MISSIONARY JOURNEY***

Beginning from chapter 13, Paul occupies the centre stage of the Acts of the Apostles. Paul's base is Antioch of Syria which has emerged as a second centre of Christianity after Jerusalem. With the arrival of Paul in Antioch (previously Paul was in his native place Tarsus from where Barnabas brought him to Antioch) the community felt confident to send out missionaries, and assisted by the Holy Spirit they entrusted the mission to Paul and Barnabas. Their journey takes them to the Antioch of Pisidia where there is a synagogue. Paul makes a speech there and as a result many Jews and Gentiles accept Paul's message. Troubles start when they meet again on the following Sabbath. At the sight of the large gathering, the Jews become envious and attack Paul. Rather than trying to appease them, Paul solemnly declares his turning to the Gentiles. Gentiles become happy because they also become sharers in God's salvation. There is persecution and the apostles leave the place.

2ND READING: ***THE SALVATION OF THE RIGHTEOUS***

St John describes the salvation of the righteous in a very dramatic manner. Their number is innumerable and they come from all nations. The great tribulation of which the author speaks is the crisis of the end-time which involves persecution for the faithful. The robes the redeemed wear symbolize the inner or spiritual state of the person. The transformation of a person from soiled (sinful) to clean (holy) is closely related to the death of Jesus understood as a sacrifice. The fundamental allusion here seems to be repentance, conversion and baptism taken together as a transformation of the person. The reference to tribulation implies that perseverance in that process of transformation is also crucial for those who would share in the victory of God and the Lamb. The final verses express the

meaning of salvation.

GOSPEL: ***THE GOOD SHEPHERD***

The image of the sheep who hear the voice of the Good Shepherd and follow him so that he might give them eternal life make up the major descriptions of the authentic believer. A believer who hears Jesus has eternal life and who follows him is never lost. A person who believes in Jesus cannot be snatched away from him. It is because the life the believer receives from attachment to Jesus is a gift from the Father. No power is greater than God, and thus the believer's union with God is also assured. God the Father is greater than all other powers. As Israel celebrates God's presence at the feast of the Dedication, Jesus tells "the Jews" that there is another way God is present to them. They can be sure they are in the Father's hand if they believe in Jesus. Jesus insists that faith in his word ties the believer not only to him but also to God, the Father of Jesus. There is no longer need to look at the Temple of Jerusalem to know of God's presence. Jesus, who stands before them points to himself and claims that he is the visible presence of God among them.
