

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY! FIRST READING: Acts 15:1 - 2, 22 - 29

A controversy arose among the disciples whether or not gentile converts were to be circumcised according to Mosaic law. At a Jerusalem meeting the Holy Spirit, the apostles, and the elders decided gentiles should not be burdened by such laws.

SECOND READING: Revelation 21:10 - 14, 22 - 23

•An angel carried the visionary to the top of a mountain to view the holy city •Jerusalem coming down from God in heaven. There was no temple because •the Lord God and the Lamb were the temple.

GOSPEL READING: John 14:23 - 29

Jesus said to His disciples, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to Him and make our dwelling with Him." As we approach Pentecost, let us consider the role the Holy Spirit plays in our lives. Jesus teaches His disciples that they will be able to rely on the Holy Spirit for guidance and instruction. Indeed, in Acts we see the leaders of the church trusting the Holy Spirit to guide them in deciding what to require of Gentile converts. As we listen to God's word today, let us recall the gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

LITURGY AND WORD

IST READING: THE JERUSALEM COUNCIL

When Paul and Barnabas return to Antioch after the first missionary journey, they encounter a problem regarding the admission of the Gentiles into the Christian fold. The problem is created by some Jewish Christians who while coming to Antioch spread the news that the observance of the Mosaic Law is necessary for salvation. Now this position of the influential Jewish Christians is diametrically opposed to the teaching of Paul. But neither Paul nor the community of Antioch was able to solve the problem because some Christians of Antioch are reluctant to yield to the view of Paul and Barnabas that the Gentile Christians have no need to submit to circumcision or observe the Mosaic Law. Hence, the community decides to forward the problem to the apostles in Jerusalem which is the mother church. The meeting of the apostles and delegates in Jerusalem about 50 A.D. is the famous Jerusalem Council.

When the meeting is held, the apostolic and presbyteral college of Jerusalem officially recognizes the evangelization of the Gentiles, which has been initiated by Peter and carried out on a wide scale by Paul and Barnabas. It leads to the definitive break of the Christian Church from its Jewish matrix. In any case, we see that the Jerusalem Council tries to settle the problem of dietary and marital disputes among the Gentile and Jewish Christians in the churches by invoking regulations from OT Code of Holiness (Lev 17–18) and passing them on to Christians of Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia in the form of a letter. This is the so-called Jerusalem Decree.

2ND READING: THE NEW JERUSALEM

The Book of Revelation closes with a majestic view of the New Jerusalem, the heavenly Church of the future, the veritable kingdom of God. The heavenly Jerusalem that John sees as coming down from heaven is a glorious entity. It has twelve gates on which the names of the twelve tribes are written and the wall stands on twelve foundations representing the twelve apostles.

GOSPEL: THE GIFT OF PEACE

The disciple who loves Jesus will keep his word. But Jesus promises more: "and we will come to them and make our home with them."

LITURGY AND WORD CONT'D

When will this "coming" be? The Father and the Son will come and they will establish an abiding presence with the believer. At table with his disciples Jesus opens a discourse by speaking of a time between his departure and his future coming (vv 2-3). This period will be filled by the presence of the Paraclete and the life-giving presence of the departed and exalted Lord in the worshipping community. The departed Jesus comes to the disciples who are not abandoned as "orphans." Those who love and believe experience the presence of the Lord Jesus and they can look forward to a final coming, when Jesus and the Father will abide definitively with them (v. 23). Jesus leaves a precious gift with his disciples: the gift of peace. The peace Jesus offers is his peace, and it is this qualification that makes it something the world can never match. The peace of Jesus flows from his oneness with his Father and the authority he has with the Father, so that whatever is asked in his name will be given.
