SECOND READING: Revelation 5:11 - 14

The author of Revelation had a vision and heard the voices of countless angels who surrounded the heavenly throne. They cried, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain ... to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and •ever."

GOSPEL READING: John 21:1 - 19

•Peter and the disciples fished all night but caught nothing. Jesus appeared to •them, telling them to cast their nets again, and immediately the nets were filled with fish. After they ate, Jesus told Simon Peter, "Feed my lambs ... Tend my sheep."

In the decades after the Resurrection, the Risen Lord was portrayed in many different ways. In his Gospel, John shows Jesus interacting with His disciples in the flesh, as He had before His death and resurrection. The author of revelation visualizes Jesus in glory surrounded by angels and other worldly creatures. In Acts, Luke portrays Jesus always on the lips and in the minds of the apostles. Listening to today's readings, think about how you visualize Jesus.



By getting Pilate, the official representative of the Emperor, to pronounce the death sentence on Jesus the Jewish authorities have hoped that they have closed the Jesus' chapter. But their hope is short lived. They have failed in their assessment of Jesus. They now try to intimidate the apostles by telling them not to preach in the name of Jesus, but Peter says that they will rather now obey God than the Jewish opponents. The apostles who have seen the risen Lord have no more fear to suffer. They are happy that they are counted worthy to suffer for their Lord.
