

LITURGY AND WORD

1ST READING: LADY WISDOM

The Book of Proverbs contains short, insightful sayings that summarize collective wisdom. The proverbs provide concise bits of wise advice passed on from parents to their children to train them properly for an upright life. We should note, however, that the text is written as if it were an instruction of a father to a son. Women and girls were not originally in view because of the standard patriarchal stance of Israelite society. Yet many proverbs can be applied equally to both genders. The book may be divided into seven sections. The first section (1:1—9:18) from which our reading is taken provides a poetic overview of the nature of wisdom. It is well known that Biblical wisdom is personified as a woman. Hence, the Lady Wisdom emerges as a side of God that embodies truth and willingly guides young men/women on their way to adulthood. Having said this, the relevance of the reading for the feast that we are celebrating is this: the superiority of Wisdom over all things is due to her origin before them. Speaking in the first person Wisdom says that she is the product of creation. Being the first to be created she is at the side of God when he creates the rest of the universe. Before the coming of the Son of God, the second person of the Trinity, God is never alone. Wisdom is always by his side.

2ND READING: SUFFERING PRODUCES ENDUR-ANCE

In this passage Paul brings in the Trinity and explains the role of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit in the life of a believer. First of all, he says that on account of our faith we enjoy peace with God, gain access to God's grace and favour, and the hope of sharing God's glory. Next, Paul says that he rejoices in his suffering. Normally suffering produces despair in human beings. The point that Paul wishes to arrive at is that suffering produces endurance; endurance produces character; and character produces hope. This hope is in sharing the glory of God which is the ultimate end of suffering. Jesus' sufferings have led to his glory, and believers who are united to Christ will follow the same pattern of receiving the glory as the end-result of suffering. Lastly, Paul is certain that the hope of the believers will not prove disappointing because they are filled with God's

love through the Holy Spirit whom they have already received. The emphasis in this paragraph is on God's love, the Spirit who pours this love into human hearts, on Christ Jesus as the mediator of that love, and on reconciliation as the effect produced by that love.

GOSPEL: THE SPIRIT WILL GUIDE THE DISCIPLES

John says that the Holy Spirit plays an important role within the community. It will guide the disciples in the future, since Jesus has not been able to tell his disciples everything they must know, nor have they been able to understand his words and actions prior to his glorification. The "truth" in which the Holy Spirit guides the community is the belief in Jesus as the sole revelation of God and the one who speaks the words of God. The Holy Spirit like Jesus does not speak "on his own". His function is to glorify Jesus and to take what the Father has given Jesus and declare it to his disciples.
