

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19 - 21

The Lord instructed Elijah to anoint Elisha as a prophet to succeed him. Elijah went to Elisha and threw his cloak over him. Receiving this sign, Elisha slaughtered his oxen for his people to eat. Then he left to follow Elijah.

SECOND READING: Galatians 5:1, 13 - 18

•Paul preached the freedom of Christ to the Galatians. He encouraged them not to take on the burden of slavery a second time. "I say, then: live by the Spirit."

GOSPEL READING: LUKE 9:51 - 62

As Jesus proceeded toward Jerusalem, He encouraged passersby to break with the past and follow Him. "Go and proclaim the kingdom of God," He invited. "No one who ... looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." In today's Gospel, Jesus, knowing what was to come, "resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem." On this journey, which will stretch over many months of reading from Luke's Gospel, Jesus teaches His disciples and the crowds how God wants us to live our lives. Today we learn that discipleship demands a total commitment. Listening to today's readings, we have the opportunity to think of what we are willing to leave behind on our journey toward the kingdom of God.

LITURGY AND WORD

IST READING: CALL OF ELISHA

Elijah receives the divine command to anoint Elisha as his successor. Now, Elisha is an industrious man and Elijah meets him as he is ploughing his field. He is a man of means and has twelve yoke of oxen which indicates his affluence. The casting of the mantle on Elisha is a sign of prophetic call. When a person is called to a prophetic mission, there is always an initial reluctance which we see in the case of Moses and other prophets. Elijah also does not like the response of Elisha and he grants him permission to do what he wants, to say farewell to his parents. Elisha immediately does away with his oxen, in fact, makes a feast with them after having slaughtered all of them. Though initially Elisha hesitates, he eventually leaves everything to follow Elijah.

2ND READING: USE FREEDOM WELL

In this passage Paul speaks of the freedom we have as Christians. Paul knows, however, that freedom can be turned into license, and so Paul clarifies the obligations of those who have been freed. The apostle goes on to describe the right and wrong uses of freedom. Freedom is abused when it becomes an excuse to indulge in sinful activities. The right use of freedom is to serve one another in love. The entire law is summed up in a single command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'

GOSPEL: CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP

As Jesus begins the journey to Jerusalem, he sends messengers to a Samaritan town but they will not receive them. Seeing the rejection James and John want to destroy them. But Jesus does not agree with them. The animosity between the Jews and the Samaritans can be traced to the days of the destruction of the North by the King of Assyria in 721 B.C. He had deported the people of Samaria and brought people from Assyria and settled them there. They are despised by the orthodox Jews who consider them heretics. This hatred between the orthodox Jews and

the Samaritans is shown in their refusal to welcome Jesus and his disciples who are travelling to Jerusalem. Hospitality has been sacred among the people of Israel, and to refuse it to someone is considered a grave sin. That is why John and James are so scandalized that

heaven and burn them up, as Elijah had done in the Old Testament to the soldiers sent by the King Ahaziah (2 Kgs 1:10-12). But Jesus rebukes the overzealous disciples.

The gospel of today presents three candidates to discipleship. The first wants to follow Jesus wherever he goes. But he misunderstands the degree of self-sacrifice involved for Jesus demands total commitment from those who want to be his disciples. It is only by renouncing oneself and taking up the cross can one follow Christ.

Jesus himself invites another one. But he asks from Jesus permission to go and bury his father. In all cultures, the obligation of a son with regard to his dead father or mother is sacred. Jesus is not cancelling the fourth commandment; he is only asserting the precedence of the first commandment to love God above everything.

Similarly also the third one, "Lord, let me first say farewell to those at my home." This reminds of the first reading. Elisha also has made a similar request. But then Elisha, realizing that in this way he can lose the calling to the prophetic mission, gives it up, and having killed the pair of oxen he has been ploughing with, he uses the plough for firewood and prepares a meal for those working with him and then follows Elijah in his prophetic ministry. Jesus requires from his disciples the same radical detachment and dedication.
