

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Sirach 3:17 - 18, 20, 28 - 29

*Conduct your affairs more humbly, the greater you are, and God will favor you. •A wise person always takes joy in listening to others.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 12:18 - 19, 22 - 24a

Our God draws near to our mountain and city. The judge of all comes close into our assembly. Jesus our mediator reaches to touch us and invites us to touch Him. We join the festal gathering of our living God.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 14:1, 7 - 14

The exalted shall be humbled and the humble exalted. When you have a dinner, invite poor people or persons with disabilities. Have a reception for persons who cannot repay you, "For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

True humility requires that we acknowledge our weaknesses, our imperfections, our humanness. We are not more important than our neighbor. Sirach offers this as a lesson to guide the listener. Jesus tries to teach this to the Pharisees in the Gospel we hear today. Humility begets generosity, as it recognizes the value in our neighbor, especially those who are put down. True generosity is shown when giving to those who cannot repay.

LITURGY AND WORD

IST READING: HUMILITY VS INTELLECTUAL PRIDE

In this reading the author writes about humility and warns against intellectual pride. A humble person will be loved by others and by God. The warnings against intellectual pride are often read against the background of the author's own conflict with Hellenistic philosophy and culture around 200 BC. But they apply to people of any age and are presented here as general statements. Those who neglect God's laws in order to meddle in things beyond them go astray; they thus display a "hard heart" that ends in destruction.

2ND READING: MOUNT SINAI VS MOUNT SION

The author makes a contrast between the Mount Sinai and Mount Sion. The Israelites who leave Egypt approach God on Mount Sinai to hear the terms of his covenant and discover what it means to serve him as a holy nation (Exod 19:5-6). The author highlights the physical terrors that are part of that event. So awesome has been this encounter with God that even Moses the mediator has trembled with fear. But Mount Sion can be understood as the ultimate goal of God's people when they leave Egypt. Men and women of faith in OT times have looked forward to this city but those who have come to God through Jesus Christ are now part of that heavenly scene. This is a vivid way of saying that we have secured the promised eternal inheritance through faith in Jesus and his work.

GOSPEL: THE HUMBLE WILL BE EXALTED

In these sayings, Jesus offers indirect counsel to his disciples about the modes of conduct towards other human beings. He does this by commenting, first of all, on the manoeuvring of his fellow guests, which he has observed, as they seek out for themselves the best places. He castigates them for seeking out positions of prestige. Obviously, there are places of honour at a banquet. He lets it be known that real honour will come not from one's self-seeking choices, but from what is bestowed on one by another. Honour before one's peers comes not from what one does on one's own behalf, but depends on the estimate others have on one. Jesus' point is expressed at the end of verse 10, "Then you will enjoy honour before all who are at table with you. For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted." It is God who will humble the one who exalts himself and exalt the one who humbles himself. Hence the attitude of Christian disciples should be umility, not status-seeking.

LITURGY AND WORD CONT'D

In the second saying Jesus moves from selfseeking ambition to selfish recompense and tries to counteract this as well. He counsels this time, not his fellow guests, but his host. He suggests that the kind of people one should invite to dinners is not one's friends, brothers, relatives, or rich neighbours. But, the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. Four affluent types of human beings, able to recompense, are contrasted with four unfortunate types, unable to do so. Real love never reckons with recompense; and because this is so, generosity will find its reward at the resurrection. The reciprocity expected must give way to a return in another, unexpected form – a return, not from the unfortunates who have not the wherewithal to reciprocate the host's kindness and graciousness, but from God himself. The host who invites such unfortunates will find himself among the "upright" at the resurrection.

The sayings of the Lucan Jesus in vv 12-14 fit into the general Lucan theme of the use of material things.
