

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Wisdom 9:13 - 18b

No one understands heaven or earth completely, but God sends wisdom and the Holy Spirit to light up the paths of those who search for the way.

SECOND READING: Philemon 9 - 10, 12 - 17

While Paul was in prison, he begged Philemon to receive back the runaway slave, Onesimus, as a beloved brother and partner in Christ.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 14:25 - 33

Jesus taught His followers the hard lesson of the cross: good accounting, careful planning, anticipating changes, decision making, and finishing the job.

Today's lessons are not easy. Wisdom acknowledges that God's ways cannot be understood through human thought. Jesus, explaining what it takes to follow Him, repeatedly frames the requirements as "whoever does not ... cannot be my disciple." But Paul is encouraging and positive, speaking of the conversion of someone who was once a slave, but is now a brother and partner. As we listen today, let us find hope in our mission as Christ's twenty-first century disciples.

LITURGY AND WORD

IST READING: WISDOM AND GOD'S COUNSEL

The answer to the two questions that the author poses at the beginning of today's reading, namely, "What man can learn the counsel of God? Or who can discern what the Lord wills?" is, of course, no one. For God's counsel cannot be known. The author alludes to the Platonic notion that the body is a hindrance for the soul. But the author firmly retains the typically Jewish idea about the inseparable bond between body and soul which has become a basic tenet of Christianity.

2ND READING: ONESIMUS IS A BROTHER

Paul's Letter to Philemon is the shortest letter in the Pauline corpus. The occasion for the Letter is that Onesimus, a slave of Philemon, meets Paul while he is in prison. He has been converted by Paul. It is believed that Onesimus has been a runaway slave who has escaped from his master Philemon. Incidentally Philemon has been also converted by Paul. Paul writes to Philemon to accept Onesimus not only as a slave but as a Christian brother by forgiving him if he has done something wrong. Although Paul wants to keep Onesimus with him, it s Philemon's right as master to decide on the matter. It is wrong to accuse Paul that he does not write against the practice of slavery. Slavery has been legal at the time of Paul. It has taken centuries to legally abolish slavery.

GOSPEL: DISCIPLESHIP IS A TOUGH TASK

In the Lucan travel account Jesus' dinner-table talk has now come to an end, and the evangelist proceeds to draw our attention to Jesus' progress on his journey to Jerusalem and to the crowds accompanying him. He now portrays Jesus speaking about the conditions of discipleship (Lk 14:25-33). The immediately preceding context spoke of an invitation extended far and wide to people on the streets and lanes, highways and hedgerows to come into the banquet of the kingdom – so that "my house will be filled" (v 23). Now Jesus' words add a different consideration: the conditions of discipleship in the kingdom. The first condition calls for a willingness to put parents, family, relatives, even one's own self, in subordination to discipleship. Only the person who is capable of a radical and painful decision, – to leave all natural and human relations behind and to give up life itself in martyrdom – can really become a disciple of Jesus. The second condition calls for the disciple to carry his/her cross and walk behind

time of Jesus, the Romans have been wont to execute criminals by crucifying them. The condemned person himself would carry the cross or at least the cross beam to the place of execution. Jesus himself would be subjected to this form of torture and death. Hence to take up the cross means to renounce completely one's own life, and give it up as Christ has done out of love for us. The disciple should carry the cross not only at the end of his life but every day. The whole life of the disciple is a sacrificial journey with Christ to Jerusalem. The disciple is called upon to imitate Jesus the suffering servant and make a gift of his life to God and to his brothers and sisters in love by embracing the cross and following Christ. The third condition calls for a radical renunciation of all one's material possessions. The seriousness demanded by the three conditions is now presented in the twin parables (vv 28-32). Jesus counsels his followers not to decide on discipleship without advance, mature probing. One must consider not only the demands to be made but also the consequences of what may be begun but left half-done because of a lack of follow-through. Ridicule or surrender to unconditional terms should deter one from rash and unreflective decisions.

A modern reader of the passage may wonder at the words of Jesus who says the prospective disciple should hate his closest relatives. But this is not an isolated statement of Jesus in the gospel of Luke. Earlier in the Gospel Jesus has said, "Blessed are you when men hate you, and when they exclude you and revile you, and cast out your name as evil, on account of the Son of Man!"
