INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE DAY!

FIRST READING: Malachi 3:9 - 20a

The Sun of Justice shines with healing warmth on those who walk in the Lord, but evildoers face a blazing oven, for the day of the Lord is coming.

SECOND READING: 2 Thessalonians 3:7 - 12

Paul urged members of the church in Thessalonica to conduct themselves in a way that befits Christ's followers. He asked them to work in the community and earn their keep.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 21:5 - 19

Jesus urged patient endurance for His followers when they face trial or contradiction. He consoled them and calmed their worries in the midst of war, earthquake, disease, and hunger.

Malachi sets the tone today when he speaks of fire consuming the earth. Scary. But his message does not end there. He goes on to say that healing and justice will come as well. Jesus does the same. After warning of persecutions, He assures His disciples that those who place their trust in the Lord will be kept safe. Let us listen today for those messages of hope and pray that we can persevere in our faith.

LITURGY AND WORD

IST READING: GOD SPARES THE FAITHFUL

Malachi means "my messenger". The predominant theme of Malachi is Israel's covenantal relationship with Yahweh and its significance. But other themes are also present, such as, the day of the Lord as in today's reading. The coming of the day of the Lord will vindicate his justice, when the wicked are separated from the righteous by the fire of the divine judgement. The righteous will escape the destructive wrath of God by virtue of their special covenantal relationship with him and will experience the blessings of messianic restoration. The day of the Lord is a day when God will spare those who are faithful and those who serve him. For the rest it will be a day when the arrogant and every evil-doer will be burned up like stubble.

2ND READING: DO NOT LIVE IN IDLENESS

In this passage Paul enunciates a specific command against idleness because of the overheated expectations of the day of the Lord. Some have not been working (probably because they thought that there was only a very short time left and work seemed useless). This is not imitating Paul, who during his stay among them, precisely in order to set an example, has been working day and night. Hence Paul can say that if anyone does not want to work, let that person not eat. The way of life that the Thessalonians have adopted gives the Church a bad name, and therefore Paul speaks out strongly against it. Paul and his companions do not live in idleness. Rather, they have worked hard to avoid being a nuisance to other people. This is despite the fact that Paul believes strongly and teaches that Churches have an obligation to provide for their teachers but Paul has given up this privilege.

GOSPEL: ENDURANCE IS THE KEY TO SUCCESS

The Jerusalem Temple admired by those with Jesus has been the project of project of Herod the Great, who in 20/19 B.C. had begun its reconstruction. reaches. Jesus predicts emphatically its total annihilation (leaving no "stone upon stone").

As Jesus describes the coming persecutions, he sees them coming from Jewish and Gentile sources, from synagogues and prisons, from kings and prefects. All of this will befall them because of "his name". Such persecution will challenge his followers to "bear witness, give testimony" that they are "Christians". In view of this persecution, Jesus exhorts his followers not to worry about or be concerned about the kind of defence they will make before Jewish or Gentile authorities, because Jesus himself will give them words and wisdom to confound those who try them. The words and wisdom that Jesus will give will be such that their adversaries will not be able to counter them or win out over them. What is implied is that victory will be theirs in such trials.

But Jesus warns that the followers will face this persecution not only from outsiders, Jewish or Gentile adversaries, but even from their own kith and kin. Members of their own families and good friends will turn against them, because they bear his "name". Moreover, the persecution will take the form, not only of arrest and imprisonment, but of death – at least for some of them. And the reason will always be: hatred because of "my name" (v 17).

Jesus exhorts his followers still further, guaranteeing them victory, by quoting for them a proverb, "not a hair of your head will be lost."
