

Pastor's Desk

My Dear Parishioners,

This Gospel passage is dealing with membership in the Church. In the early church, the question arose as to what to do about those good people who were not disciples of Jesus and were not members of the Christian community. This is still a question for us today.

Saint Mark gives an answer to this question and does a balancing act. For those people who are not members of this Christian community or who do not follow Jesus, he tells us, Jesus appreciates all the good that were done by these people. He is tolerant and refuses to show any sign of rejection. He even says: "Whoever is not against us is for us." However, it is not because Jesus says so, then we are excused not to do our part as Christians and practicing Catholics. Through our baptism, we were given the grace of faith and the grace of discipleship to enjoy closeness with Him. We were given so much, therefore, much will be required of us. "To whom much is given, much will be required" (Lkl2:48). Baptized Catholics shouldn't find this passage as an excuse for them for example, not to fulfill their Sunday obligation by attending Holy Mass or not getting involved in the life of the church. This isn't an excuse for laxity. Rather, an invitation to appreciate the good that is done even by those who are out of the Christian boundaries. Mahatma Gandhi is one of them.

Finally, when Jesus was talking about cutting off a hand or a foot or even tearing out an eye. He did not have a punitive mutilation in mind when he said, "if your hand causes you to sin, cut it off" nor did he wish to be taken literally. Jesus demands that we remain loyal to his call with all we have. The temptations to sin will not disappear by cutting off parts of our body, they come from the heart and that is where we have to make the right choices without compromise.
