FROM THE Pastor's Desk

HOLY FAMILY MINISTRIES & REPRESENTATIVES

My Dear Parishioners,

Today's Scripture Readings are designed to teach us the truth that not everyone who finishes first is victorious. Sometimes those who take the last seat are the real winners in the game of life. The two brothers, the sons of Zebedee - James and John come to Jesus asking for the top seats in his Kingdom. They were thinking of promotion. When the other ten heard what these two were asking, they were indignant, not because they were humble but because these two went ahead of them in asking him the same request. The remaining ten was very angry because they thought of themselves more qualified than James and John. Maybe each one of us also is upset of the two because they are ambitious and selfish. If this is our attitude, then, we forget that we too are guilty as they were. We may have been doing the same things with our co-workers, fellow parishioners and fellow humans. We want to go ahead of them to the extent that we step on them and using them as our stepping stones to reach our selfish goal and personal interest.

Jesus uses this incident to teach his disciples and us all, some valuable lessons about leadership and service to others. Disciples of Jesus are not called to a position of power, but of service. They are not called to a position to rule over other people but a leadership through service: For: "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant...For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve."

Let us ask ourselves: Are we willing to go through and to live what Jesus is saying: "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant?" what are we looking for? Are we looking for promotion, honor and fame? Do we want to be the boss or do we want to be of service to all? **Blessed Sunday to you all!**
