My Dear Parishioners,

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul," with all your mind and with all your strength...you shall love your neighbor as you love yourself," (Mk 12:30-31). This is the words of Jesus when one of the scribes asked Him which is the first of all commandments. Jesus refers to two Biblical passages and joins them to form two faces of one supreme commandment of love. These are like the two beams that make up a cross. One points upward and one points sideward. These two dimensions constitute what it means to be an authentic Christian. The first: Deut 6:4-5 invites Israel then and us today to a joyful union with and total love of God. This is the vertical dimension of the commandment of love. But the problem is, there are people who overstress the love of God. They want to shut other people out of their lives; they want to live for God alone and spend their day praying. If you ask them to help you to do something, they say: "I'll pray for you." The second, from the Book of Leviticus, invites us today to love our neighbor as we do ourselves (19:18). This is the horizontal dimension of the commandment. But, just like the commandment of loving God, there are also people who do just the opposite. They are totally involved in helping people: the sick, the poor, the drug addict, people with problems... They are so busy that they have no time to pray. They say: "My work is my prayer." Jesus in today's gospel said to us clearly: "Love God and love your neighbor." Let us pray for the grace of being able fold our hands in prayer in church and open our hands to others outside of the church. Blessed Sunday to you all!
