Sacrament of Baptism

Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) Classes

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes

RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. My Dear Parishioners,

Forgiveness and Prayer.

Today we continue the reading of Genesis 18 with Abraham's intercession for Sodom and Gomorrah. This is the continuation of the welcome of Mambré. where Abraham welcomed the Life of God into his life with the promise of the birth of Isaac. In the rest of this chapter 18, Abraham in turn becomes a bearer of life by making himself the intercessor with God for the sinners of Sodom and Gomorrah. His praver is a bearer of life and forgiveness, like the Lord's Praver that Jesus teaches his disciples in today's Gospel. In the Old Testament, as in the New, God is primarily the judge of His creation. He assumes this role of Father who often must judge the sinful acts of his children. In the Old Testament, as in the New, his judgment is forgiveness, even if the consequences of man's sin always have repercussions in his life. But it is not just a vertical relationship descending from God to man. Man, in turn, must be forgiven if he is in relationship with God, who is always close to him through praver.
