

#### Sacrament of Baptism

Fourth Sunday of each month. Please register your children at the Church Office. Present a copy of the child(ren)'s birth certificate(s). A minimum of 2 classes is required.

#### **Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) Classes**

Classes are held every Saturday during the school year and begin with attendance and instruction in the lower level of Columban Hall at 9:00 a.m.

#### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes

RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. please call the church office at (340) 775-1650.

## Weekly Reflection

Dear God's people, precious members of the Friendliest Parish,

#### "Seduced by Christ"

From the moment the Apostle Peter seems to have mysteriously grasped, without really under-standing, what Jesus' true nature is, he is unable to accept what Jesus' mission implies, and how far Jesus is willing to give of himself. By announcing his passion and death, Jesus not only arouses Peter's indignation, but also invites his disciples to take up their cross.

How can we understand Jesus' invitation to take up our cross courageously this Sunday?

In the first reading Jeremiah complains that God would lead him to success and easy life; instead he ended up as what seemed a total failure.

the gospel we see that peter thinks like Jeremiah and does not accept a suffering, defeated Messiah. Jesus spells out conditions for those who follow him; so that nobody will be able to say they were seduced with flattery or false promises.

The second reading is very close to this theme. It invites us not to go along with the way everybody else thinks. Others people may not find the life of a Christian acceptable.

"If any man will walk behind me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me. Here we are following Christ, and to carry our cross as he did is to accept our vocation as men and women loved by God, despite obstacles and suffering.

Jesus reminds us that we are not alone when we carry our crosses, that we are invited to walk with him.

Our following of Christ enables us to go forward in life with confidence, and to be victorious with him, for his cross is above all a glorious cross. It is the symbol of our ultimate victory over death. And that's what the cross is all about.
