WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: Exodus 22:20-26

Reflection for the 30th Sunday in ordinary time year A

{The Pharisee's question about the greatest commandment is an opportunity for Christ to return to the foundation of the Law. The commandment to love God and neighbor becomes a criterion of discernment in relation to the multitude of obligations that have been added over time. Christ's teaching is liberating in this respect. It also sheds light on our own questions and discussions with Christ. It sheds light on some of our present difficulties and gives us a fundamental orientation to apply in each particular situation.}

Brothers and sisters,

Last Sunday, the trap set for Jesus by the Pharisees and scribes concerned the tax due to Caesar; today, it concerns the Great Commandment. Why is this so? Because the Pharisees, in their zeal to implement the whole law, formulated numerous commandments, all taken from the law and the prophets, which were to define how to be a faithful Jew. Over 613 commandments to keep. Many who heard this preaching on the countless commandments might have been a little lost. By asking Jesus which commandment was the greatest, the Pharisees wanted to test him against their own teaching.

Jesus' answer was something new: the two commandments Jesus recalled were quotes from Scripture. All Jews know by heart, and so do we Christians, "love the Lord your God with all your strength, with all your heart and with all your mind" and "love your neighbor as yourself." What's new is to take these two commandments, love of God and love of neighbor, as a criterion of discernment against the multitude of things that were detailed by the commandments of the Pharisees, to the point that no one - could be sure of really carrying out all the commandments.

How can we say, as Saint John repeats in his first epistle, that "we love God whom we do not see, if we do not love the brothers he gives us and whom we see"? Here's a criterion for discernment. I can call myself a Christian, a disciple of Christ, faithful to God, but am I a Christian, a disciple of Christ and faithful to God in my behavior with the men and women around me, with strangers, especially with those who are the most deprived and abandoned in our world?

These two commandments, love of God and love of our brothers and sisters, bring together, sum up and summarize all the law and all the prophets. All the situations into which existence throws us, all the opportunities or difficulties we face, cannot be resolved simply by detailed commandments. They can only be solved by the fundamental orientation of love for God and for our brothers and sisters, which makes us choose and build the best, or least worst, solutions for every situation we find ourselves in.

Let us pray to the Lord that the controversies recounted in the Gospel may shed light on the controversies we ourselves harbor in our hearts, and help us to understand how obedience to God, the law and the prophets is fulfilled in love for our brothers and sisters.

Sacrament of Infant Baptism


