WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: Is 5:1-7 Responsorial Psalm: Ps 80:9, 12, 13-14, 15-16, 19-20 Second Reading: Phil 4:6-9 Gospel: Mt 21: 33-43

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the Bible, the vineyard is a symbol of well-being, prosperity and peace. It is a place of happiness, where the covenant between God and man is fully lived out. When people remember a time of tranquility and peace, they evoke the vine:

So when Christ mentions the vine, we expect a story of peace and prosperity. But in today's text, those in charge of the vineyard are only thinking of killing to seize property that doesn't belong to them.

The first important element in this story is that God puts us in charge, entrusting us with his vineyard. He wants us to be his partners. So it's good to ask ourselves what we're doing with the Lord's vineyard. What's happening to the world God has entrusted to us? How am I living in my Christian community? These are pertinent questions for each and every one of us responsible for our land. Our quality of life is affected by all these problems.

As in today's parable, we can believe that we are the owners of the world entrusted to us, and do everything we can to keep the fruits for ourselves in a selfish way, without thinking of others and without worrying about what we will leave to future generations.

Many believe that by getting rid of God, the vineyard will belong to them. That's what Adam and Eve did when they followed the serpent's advice: "You will be like God... you will take God's place... you will be gods." Many are convinced that God is cumbersome, that they don't need him. He has no place in public life, in the world of politics and business. The Gospel, on the other hand, reveals that the more God is present, the more we will be able to create a world of peace, brotherhood and love.

In the parable of the vinedressers, God invites us to take responsibility for building a better world. This responsibility is not just for governments and community leaders, but for each and every one of us. God entrusts us with our family, our children and grandchildren, our world of work and leisure. We must give an account of our stewardship. The fruits of our talents and efforts, the time we are given, the money and goods we possess - all these must serve the well-being of all.

The sin of the vinedressers in the parable is to want to appropriate fruit that does not belong to them. They want to manage the land for their own profit and gain. Reflecting on what's happening in our world today, we realize that since the time of Jesus, no progress has been made in terms of selfishness and irresponsibility! Nothing new under the sun!

The message of today's parable is that God has entrusted us with the world we live in, for the good of all. It's up to us to respond to this invitation with all the talents we've been given.
