



WEEKLY REFLECTION

Reflection by Rev Fr Modeste

"The day of the Lord will come like a thief at night."

Brethren!

Throughout November, we continue to pray for our deceased. It's a way of rekindling our hope in the face of the mysterious reality of death. This prayer invites us to reflect on our lives and what makes them worthwhile. The only thing that will remain is our love for God and our brothers and sisters. As Pope John Paul II put it: *"Tell me what your love is, and I'll tell you who you are."* For us Christians, death is a passage to the world of God.

On this Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, only two weeks before the beginning of a new liturgical year, today's readings bring us to thoughts about the fulfillment of the salvation story. We do not know when the time will come, whether it be for ourselves individually or for God's creation in totality, but if we have responded to the grace that is given us in life, we have nothing to fear from a good and gracious God.

One day, we'll have to give him an account of our lives.

The first reading is a biblical text from the Book of Proverbs. It portrays a perfect wife in terms of her faithfulness to daily tasks. It also shows us her qualities of heart before God and before the poor. This message is still relevant today: whatever our situation, we are all invited to respond to our present vocation. God himself entrusts us with this responsibility. The good works spoken of in this reading are our love for God and our commitment to the service of others.

In his letter to the Thessalonians, the apostle Paul asks us to stay awake in the hope of the Kingdom. He is addressing Christians who live in feverish anticipation of Christ's return. This *"day of the Lord will come"* like a thief at an unexpected time and day. Paul advises Christians not to live in impatience. Nor should they fall asleep. What we are asked to do is *to remain vigilant and not let ourselves be absorbed by worries that are too material*. The Lord is coming; he is there at the heart of our lives. He asks us to be attentive to the signs of his presence, and to give him first place in our lives.

The Gospel tells us the parable of the talents. We know this parable well. But there's one thing we often forget: we're not talking about talent in the sense of competence or ability; the talent in question is a unit of currency weighing thirty pound. For a person who works twelve hours a day, this is the salary of six thousand days' work. In telling us this parable, Christ wants to convey a message of the utmost importance.

One day, we'll have to give an account of how we've managed the treasure entrusted to us. The Lord is counting on us, and he trusts us. Our only guarantee is the Word of God. The curse on the third servant is not explained by the small sum he was given. What the Master reproaches him for is his laziness. This bad servant hides God's gift. Instead, he should have placed it on a table, as one would a lighted lamp to light the house.

Perhaps this is the message of this parable. We live in this in-between time still today, waiting for the master to return, and the worst thing we can do is sit around being lazy. What will you do to help advance the coming reign of God until its full glory will be revealed in the end time? No one is deprived of God's gifts. He gives to each according to his possibilities; he asks us to give the best of ourselves to use them in the service of others. We are all sent into the world to bear witness to the love that is in God. We live in a harsh and violent world. We are all invited to be sowers of peace, joy and love.

On this day, we can take up the Missal's prayer: "Grant, O Lord, that we may find joy in our fidelity, for it is a deep and lasting happiness to serve constantly the Creator of all good." Amen.

Sacrament of Infant Baptism

Fourth Sunday of each month. Please register your children at the Church Office. Present a copy of the child(ren)'s birth certificate(s). A minimum of 2 classes is required.

Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) Classes

Classes are held every Saturday during the school year and begin with attendance and instruction in the lower level of Columban Hall at 9:00 a.m.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes

RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. Soul of Christ, sanctify me. Body of Christ, save me.


Blood of Christ, inebriate me. Water from the side of Christ, wash me.
