WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: Malachi 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10 Responsorial Psalm: Psalms 131:1, 2, 3 Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13

Gospel: Matthew 23:1-12

Dear brothers and sisters,

Last Sunday, when asked by the Pharisees and Doctors of the Law what the greatest commandment was, Jesus replied that we must "love God and love our neighbor as ourselves." Today's first reading and Gospel invite us to celebrate God's mercy. He is there to help us out of our sinful situation. These texts show us that everything good comes from God. Because God is love. He is the source of love, conversion and generosity. He is our Savior. He has no contempt for his creatures, even for the greatest sinners. Conversion is open to all.

The gospel of this 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time brings us to contemplate the chance encounter between Jesus and Zacchaeus. Through Zacchaeus' experience, we can rediscover God's gaze upon us, and make our own experience of Jesus.

But who is this Jesus who seeks us out and comes to us by becoming a man? Who is this Jesus who looks at us as no one has ever looked at us before? Who is this Jesus who dares to come to us despite our mistakes, our betrayals, our disappointments, our faults?

The first reading, from the book of Wisdom, gives us an answer: "Lord, you have pity on all men, because you can do all things. You close your eyes to their sins, so that they may be converted..." (Wis 11:23-24).

And this is what Zacchaeus experienced in his encounter with Jesus. Zacchaeus was seen as he sought to see. His encounter with Jesus shows us that God is always looking for us, even before we look for him. But we have to look for him to realize it.

Zacchaeus had obstacles preventing him from seeing Jesus: he was small in stature, the crowd crushed him, he was a public sinner, he was unloved. However, he defied his obstacles and managed to climb a sycamore tree.

Today, Zacchaeus' experience poses a question for us: What is our sycamore tree? What do we need to distance ourselves from? What is the door we open for God to enter our lives?

On this Sunday, let us pray that the God who loves us will give us the grace to truly encounter him in our lives. May each of us experience this encounter with Jesus, who said: "Today I must go and stay with you."

Sacrament of Infant Baptism


