WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: Wisdom 6:12-16

32ndSunday A Wis 6:12-16; 1 Thess 4:13-18; Mt 25:1-13 Reflection

Brothers and sisters,

Today's liturgy suggests that we are approaching the end of our liturgical year. Only two weeks to go, and we'll be celebrating Christ the King of the Universe, which marks the end of the liturgical year. Today's liturgical texts speak of waiting. Who are we waiting for? Many speak of the end of time, and even assure us that they know the date. But let's not be misled: God's time is not a matter of calculation or prophecy:

"You know neither the day nor the hour", says the Gospel (Mk 13:32). "When it comes to the Lord's coming, you don't need to be told about deadlines or dates. You know very well that the Day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night" (1Th 5, 1), says Saint Paul.

To prepare is to persevere in love and Remaining vigilant Take the young girls in today's parable. The foolish ones have put on their best finery and taken their lamps: a normal husband should be on time, if not early! Why reproach and punish them for the groom's tardiness? What's more, the refusal to share of the five wise virgins who remembered to take a supply of oil with them is shocking. To think like this is to enter a blind alley. When we read a parable, let's not get lost in the secondary points, but - as is the case in African tales let's look for the message! The main point of today's parable is that it's not enough to get off to a good start, but that we must also take the means to last, and be ready at all times to celebrate the one we love. "I sleep, but my heart watches. I hear my beloved knocking. "Open to me, my sister, my friend, my dove, my perfect one! For my head is covered with dew, my curls with drops of the night" (Song of Songs 5:2), for the bridegroom who makes himself desired is none other than Christ, returned from the night of his passion.

The virgins represent our community-bride of God.

The oil is that of baptism, which has made us the King's children. Sleep symbolizes all our lukewarmness, indifference, and death. We go days without thinking for a second about God, without praying. Our life becomes a material existence, reduced to work and pleasure. Yet eternal life begins today. How can it be lived beyond if it is not here below? But if, faithful to prayer and fraternal charity, the small flame of our goodwill still shines in the night of trials, then we can already glimpse a few features of the face of Christ. Then, after the darkness of death, "we will see him as he is". (1Jn 3:2)

The foolish brides did not know how to be ready. They let God's desire

die within them. The lamp in their hearts no longer gives off the slightest smoke. They are extinguished, dead. They have taken the foolish liberty of not entering the wedding feast. And when it comes to the decisive encounter with God, no one can love in their place. Let's not miss the rendezvous of love now. Let's not forget God, our betrothed. We must be vigilant in hope, desire and prayer.

Sacrament of Infant Baptism
