## WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:10-16 Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 146:7, 8-9, 9-10 Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28 Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

"She gave everything, everything she had to live on."

Brothers and sisters,

Jesus sat in the Temple opposite the treasury, watching the crowds deposit money in the treasury box. Many rich people were putting in large sums. A poor widow came forward and deposited two coins.

Jesus looked on and admired this poor widow as she put obolus her into the treasury. He exclaimed: "With those two little coins, she has put in more than anyone else! Everyone gave from their superfluous, she gave everything, everything she had to live on." The gift of this poor widow, who puts her two pennies in the trunk, shows the dynamism and hope that are possible in her heart. We can think of another widow named Mary, who, at the foot of the Cross, offered Jesus all she had to live on. The mystery of the woman is the mystery of the true religious attitude. At Cana, Mary detects the misery of her people and hands it over to Jesus, sharing it with her brothers: "They have no more wine." We ask Mary to prepare us to make the gift of ourselves, by preparing ourselves as she did, with the small gifts of daily life.

The woman from Sarepta did as the prophet told her: she brought him her bread roll (1<sup>st</sup> reading). At Cana, Jesus will say to Mary, "What is it between you and me?" The servants obey Jesus. Being connected to the God of hope and love means, in difficult times, responding to those who ask us for service. "She gave everything she had to live," says Jesus.

Sometimes we want to give of our superfluity, we don't find enough time for what concerns Jesus Christ and his Church, we behave like the Pharisees who like to occupy the first place to be seen. Service and sacrifice in love for others and discretion, that's what Jesus recommends to us today.

Let us ask for the grace to know how to give ourselves for others and for the service of Christ's Church. Let us ask for the grace of trust in God to live in the loving power of Jesus' resurrection.

# Catechesis

### THE DOCTRINE OF INDULGENCE IN THIS MONTH FOR DECEASED SOULS IN PURGATORY

### How to obtain indulgences for the departed

Every year, the month of November, the month of the souls in Purgatory, reminds us that we can obtain partial or plenary indulgences for the departed to hasten their admission to Heaven.

#### \*What is an indulgence?\*

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us (n°1471-1479): "Indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal penalty due for sins whose fault has already been erased, a remission which the well-disposed faithful obtains under certain determined conditions, through the action of the Church, which, as the dispenser of redemption, distributes and applies by her authority the treasure of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints" (Paul VI, Indulgentiarum doctrina) "The indulgence is partial or plenary, according to whether it partially or totally frees from the temporal penalty due for sin" (ibid). "Every member of the faithful can earn indulgences for himself or apply them to the deceased."

#### \*The penalties of sin:\*

To understand this doctrine and practice of the Church, it is necessary to see that sin has a double consequence. Grave sin deprives us of communion with God, and thereby renders us incapable of eternal life, the deprivation of which is called the "eternal penalty" of sin. On the other hand, every sin, however venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures, which needs purification, either here below or after death, in the state known as **Purgatory**. This purification frees us from the socalled "**temporal punishment**" of sin. These two punishments are not to be conceived as a kind of vengeance, inflicted by God from without, but as arising from the very nature of sin.

A conversion that proceeds from fervent charity can bring about the total purification of the sinner, so that no punishment remains. Forgiveness of sin and restoration of communion with God entail remission of the eternal penalties of sin. But the temporal penalties of sin remain. The Christian must strive, by patiently enduring suffering and trials of every kind and, when the day comes, by serenely facing death, to accept these temporal penalties of sin as a grace; he must strive, through works of mercy and charity, as well as through prayer and the various practices of penance, to strip himself completely of the "old man" and put on the "new man" (cf. Eph 4:24).

*In the communion of saints*: The Christian who seeks to purify himself of sin and sanctify himself with the help of God's grace does not find himself alone. "The life of each of God's children is linked in an admirable way, in Christ and through Christ, with the life of all the other Christian brothers and sisters, in the supernatural unity of the Mystical Body of Christ, as in a mystical person." *In the communion of saints*, "there exists between the faithful - those who are in possession of the heavenly homeland, those who have been admitted to expiate in purgatory or those who are still on pilgrimage on earth - a constant bond of love and an abundant exchange of all goods."

In this way, recourse to the communion of saints enables the contrite sinner to be purified sooner and more effectively from

the penalties of sin. We also call these spiritual goods of the communion of saints the **treasure of the Church**, "which is not a sum of goods, as is the case with material riches accumulated over the centuries, but is the infinite and inexhaustible price that the atonements and merits of Christ Our Lord have with God, offered so that humanity may be freed from sin and reach communion with the Father. It is in Christ, our Redeemer, that the satisfactions and merits of his redemption are found in abundance (cf. Heb 7:23-25; 9:11-28)."




