

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart...., with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength..... You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

Brothers and sisters,

This Sunday, the WORD OF GOD challenges us once again.

"Listen, Israel: the Lord our God is the only Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. Here's the second: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no greater commandment than these." Two commands in one. Love God and love your neighbor

The scribe continued: "Very well, Master, you are right to say that God is the Only One and that there is no other but Him. To love Him with all one's heart, with all one's intelligence, with all one's strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself, is better than all offerings and all sacrifices." This Commandment of Love is given to us so that God's Love takes over everything in us, and we can love ourselves with God's own Love. From now on, it is this Love that transforms us through our association with God-Love.

We could use the image of a king whose kingdom is astonishing in its goodness, beauty and riches to understand our situation. It's as if we were this king's little handmaiden, chosen to become queen. This little servant may be "wild," so aware of her state as a slave. It may be that fear grips her before the king's calls for her to leave her house of slavery. If she leaves in the night and the cold, it will be very difficult for her to return. She needs a mediator. Indeed, she needs to find a good path! If we frequent the God of love, we are touched by that love. Jesus, by uniting the love of God and the love of our brothers and sisters, is the Way. He leads us into a love that is a "fusion of love," a distinction between people who are united. I can trust God to the point of drawing close to him and becoming "one" with him in love.

What is the lesson for us today? The same as Those present at this exchange! We may know a lot about theory, but what about practice? We're not far from the Kingdom of God, the door is open and yet we're not entering. "Listen, people of God, open your hearts to the Word." Remember Psalm 119:105-112

Catechesis

NOVEMBER, MONTH OF THE DECEASED and Faithfull souls in purgatory

Faithfull souls in purgatory

Every year on November 2, the Roman Catholic Church celebrates the dead, or the commemoration of all the faithful departed. But what is death for Christians, and why celebrate the dead? Does purgatory exist? As the souls in purgatory undergo this purification, the prayers of the faithful can help speed up the process and deliver them from their sins. This is the main reason why Catholics pray for the dead.

Where does the soul go after Catholic death?

When we die, the soul leaves the body. Traditionally, we say that there is a particular judgment: the soul sees itself in the magnificent presence of the living God, who is all love. It is itself immensely drawn to God, it will go into God's light, it will ascend into God's light.

Why do Christians pray for the souls in purgatory?

For those who are purifying themselves in purgatory, he has allowed the saints in heaven to pray for them and help them, just as we who are still on earth do. Through our prayers, sacrifices and above all the offering of the Eucharist, we can help these souls who are waiting for God's mercy.

What is purgatory in Catholicism?

The Catholic Church maintains that "all those who die in the grace and friendship of God, but still imperfectly purified," undergo a process of purification after death, which the Church calls purgatory, "in order to attain the holiness necessary to enter into the joy of heaven."

Where in the Bible does it say to pray for the souls in purgatory?

Roman Catholics who believe in purgatory interpret New Testament passages such as 2 Timothy 1:18, Matthew 12:32, Luke 23:43, 1 Corinthians 3:11-3:15 and Hebrews 12:29 as supporting prayer for souls believed to be alive in an active, intermediate state after death, undergoing purifying flames (which could be...

"The Three States of the Church"

"When the Lord comes in glory, and all his angels with him, death will be no more, and all things will be subject to him. But at present, some of his disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are purifying themselves, while still others are in glory, contemplating in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is'." Cathecism of the Catholic Church-

The Church on earth. ("Militant church" or the "pilgrim church") is united with **the Church in heaven** ("sanctorum communion"). ("Church triumphant"). They worship God with the angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven. Between the two is **the suffering Church** in purgatory.

The Catholic Church commemorates the Triumphant Church and the Penitent Church in its liturgy on two consecutive days: All Saints' Day on November 1 (the Triumphant Church) and All Souls' Day on November 2 (the Penitent Church).




