Theme: The Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth

Dear brothers and sisters,

Here we are, on the last Sunday of Advent. To use the image of air travel, we seem to be preparing for landing. From this fourth Sunday onwards, we enter an important time. A time when each of us, as individuals, but also as a Church, assesses what we have done, what we are doing and what remains to be done, so that the encounter with Christ can indeed be a decisive turning point in our lives. Already last Sunday, the Church put us in this mood by meditating on the fundamental question that the crowd coming to be baptized asked John the Baptist: "What must we do?" On this Sunday, the Church invites us to intensify this impetus towards the encounter with Christ, who comes without further delay. From today's liturgy, we can identify 3 attitudes to bear in mind: gratitude, availability and mission.

Recognition: In the first reading, the prophet Micah announces the birth of the One who is coming to liberate the kingdom of Judah, which is plagued by insecurity and over-management. His message is, in fact, a foreshadowing of the coming of Christ into our world. Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth in the Gospel goes in the same direction. Elizabeth is consoled by this visit, which brings good news. Elizabeth is grateful for this meaningful gesture of courtesy. In fact, it's a gesture of gratitude to God, who has come to meet her.

Available: By coming into our world, God wants to make us a people eager to do good. Gratitude makes us available to do good, to console, to bless. Hence the call today, as it appears in the second reading and the Gospel, to cooperate with this will of God.

Mission: The essence of the Christmas celebration is joy. A joy that is shared as good news, as Mary does with her cousin Elizabeth. We are called today to be missionaries of joy, of good news.

May Mary and Elizabeth accompany us in welcoming the One who comes, who has come and who will come.

Sacrament of Infant Baptism: Infant Baptisms will take place on the **Fourth Sunday** of every month, parents and godparents must attend two pre-baptismal classes prior to the Baptism. Please register your child.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes: RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. To register, please call the church office at (340) 775-1650.

Catechesis By Father Modeste Digwou

How can we proclaim the joy of Christmas?

God sent angels to the shepherds to tell them that a Savior had been born. Today, He sends us to announce the Good News.

Christmas has been so co-opted by a Godless world that a growing number of our contemporaries have forgotten its very origins. Sure, the crib more or less tells them something, but they don't know that this little child lying in a simple manger has come to bring them the love and joy they so desperately seek. "I can't wait for Christmas to be over," admits 18-year-old Dany. We're not kids anymore. Santa Claus and all that is over!

So, what happens at Christmas? We eat too much, we don't sleep well, and then eight days later we have to do it all over again! Instead of bringing hope, Christmas is for Dany – and so many others – an opportunity to feel the emptiness of an existence without ideals, the weight of loneliness, bitterness at the lack of money, disgust with oneself and others.

Announcing the joy of Christmas means first of all living and sharing it. It's up to each family to find out how: invite one or more isolated people to midnight mass, serve New Year's Eve dinner to the elderly, telephone distant relatives or friends, make Christmas cards or small gifts with the children to give to neighbors or to an old lady living alone, etc. The first people we have to announce Christmas joy to are the children.

The first people we have to tell about the joy of Christmas are our children. Announcing the joy of Christmas is a reminder that God became man to save us from evil and death.

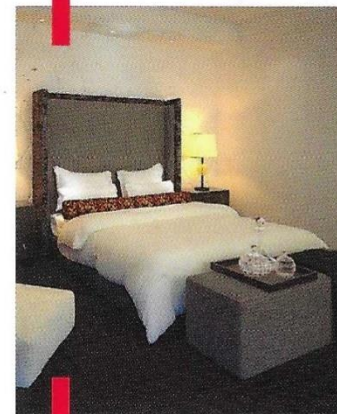
