## WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 8, 10, 12-13

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:45-49

Gospel: Luke 6:27-38 By Rev. Fr. Yacob Lonfo

Beloved in Christ, this Sunday's liturgy gives us a few spiritual ingredients on how to love our enemies. Here are the three best ways through which our Blessed Lord urges us to love our enemies: "Do good to them; Bless them and Pray for them." Which attitude would you adopt toward your enemies? Today's first reading taken from the first book of Samuel helps us to answer this question. In order to understand this passage of the first book of Samuel, it's important to contextualize it by going back to the sixteenth chapter. In fact, David after striking down the Philistine Goliath, upon their arrival from the battle ground, women came out from all the cities playing and singing: "Saul has slain his thousands, David his tens thousands". It had angered Saul and he had developed feelings of envy and jealousy toward David. Thus, David had the opportunity to retaliate but he chose not to, rather he chose to render good for evil by sparing Saul's life. He did not follow Abishai's advice, nor allowed him to harm Saul. Rather, he replied: "Do not harm him, for who can lay hands on the Lord's anointed and remain unpunished." We can bless our enemies by acknowledging their qualities. Because each person cannot only have flaws or defects but also qualities. In focusing on their qualities or on the good we can find in them will helps us not to gossip about them, but to praise God who made them.

Christ himself is not only commanding us to do something impossible, but He gave us an example as He did on the Cross, pleading and justifying the Father's forgiveness for us: "Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing" (Lk 23:34). We can fast, say the Rosary, request Masses for our enemies. In doing so, God changes our hearts and theirs as well. When we forgive, we are like Christ, the heavenly Adam and not like the first Adam, the earthily one. If we are truly people of faith, we should never worry about those who harm or hurt us, because there is a God above who watches each of our actions or intentions. He knows best how to deal with each situation we go through. As David beautifully puts it: "The Lord will reward each man for his justice and faithfulness". Trust and obey Almighty God. Amen!

**Sacrament of Infant Baptism:** Infant Baptisms will take place on the **Fourth Sunday** of every month, parents and godparents must attend two pre-baptismal classes prior to the Baptism. Please register your child.

## **Catechesis**

## Catechesis on Prayer: "Lord, teach us how to pray"

The other week before, we have begun to reflect on Prayer. After various attempts to define what prayer truly is, we have come to the conclusion that there is no life worth without Prayer, without a relationship with the Lord that will in turn impact positively the relationship that exist between us and all human beings created in the image and likeness of God (Gn 1:26). Today, we are going to continue our spiritual journey as we dive into the five types of prayer in our catholic tradition.

### I-Prayer of BLESSING and ADORATION

According to the CCC 2626, a blessing expresses the basic movement of Christian prayer: it is an encounter between God and man. The prayer of blessing is man's response to God's gifts: because God blesses, the human heart can in return bless the One who is the source of every blessing.

Adoration is the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil. Adoration is homage of the spirit to the "King of Glory," respectful silence in the presence of the "ever greater" God

#### II. PRAYER OF PETITION

The word Petition has various meaning such as to ask, beseech, plead, invoke, entreat, cry out, even "struggle in prayer." Most of the time, people tend to petition for material things. By prayer of petition we express awareness of our relationship with God. We are sinners who as Christians know that we have turned away from our Father. The first movement

of the prayer of petition is asking forgiveness, like the tax collector in the parable: "God, be merciful to me a sinner!" It is a prerequisite for righteous and pure prayer. Asking forgiveness is the prerequisite for both the Eucharistic liturgy and personal prayer. There is a hierarchy in the petitions we make: we pray first for the Kingdom, then for what is necessary to welcome it and cooperate with its coming.


#### III. PRAYER OF INTERCESSION

Intercession is a prayer of petition which leads us to pray as Jesus did. He is the one intercessor with the Father on behalf of all men, especially sinners. Since Abraham, Moses intercessions – asking on behalf of another has been characteristic of a heart attuned to God's mercy. In the age of the Church, Christian intercession participates in Christ's, as an expression of the communion of saints. In intercession, he who prays looks "not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others," even to the point of praying for those who do him harm.

The intercession of Christians recognizes no boundaries: "for all men, for kings and all who are in high positions," for persecutors, for the salvation of those who reject the Gospel.
