



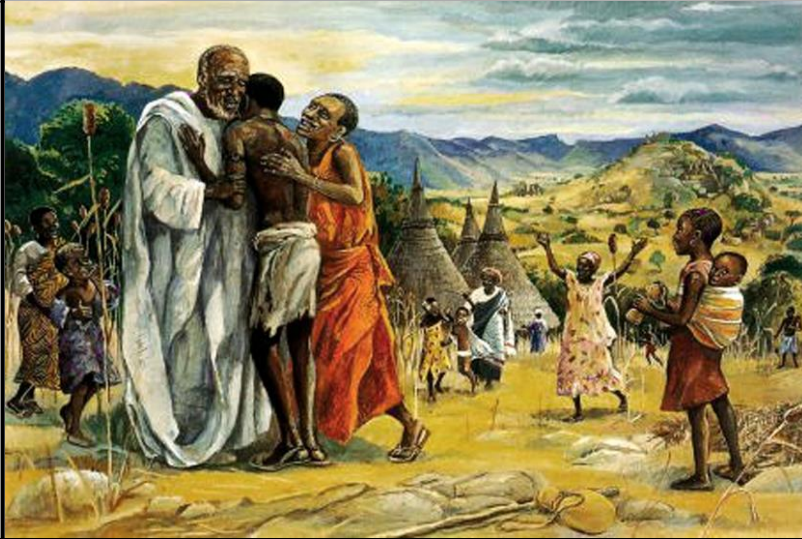

WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: Joshua 5:9a, 10-12

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Dear brothers and sisters, on this fourth Sunday of Lent, the Church invites us to experience the mercy of God our Father, and to be reconciled with him. The readings proposed for our meditation invite us to embrace the change that will only come about if we set out on our journey, taking action.

The first reading, from the Book of Joshua (Joshua 5:10-12), tells of the people of Israel settling in Jericho. With the manna gone, the people feed on the produce of the land, the fruits of their labor. This is the sign of the people's arrival in their land, the promised land.

In this Lenten season, the Lord is also walking with us to lead us to the place where we will produce more fruit. We can only truly be new creatures if we are reconciled with God and work towards reconciliation with one another.

The Gospel of Luke (Lk 15:1-32) presents reconciliation and divine mercy in the form of a parable involving a father and his two sons. The path to the father's mercy involves our adhesion. Three stages characterize this path:

Firstly, the ability to go back into ourselves to recognize our shortcomings and take the right way out, that of returning to the Father. This is the reflection of the younger son as he finds himself destitute in a faraway land. **Return to the Father.**

Secondly, to set out on a journey. It's not enough to reflect within oneself and find the evil to be corrected. The important thing is to take action, to set out for the Father's house, to experience the joy of the encounter with the merciful Father who awaits us. **The Father is always present.**

Thirdly, let us not, like the elder son, deny ourselves the joy of reconciliation. Let's not stay outside while the feast of forgiveness is in full swing inside the house. **Let us enter our Father's house of mercy.**

God is our model of forgiveness and reconciliation. Through his mercy, he invites us to show mercy to one another too.

Dear brothers and sisters, let us be reconciled to God. Let us leave this distant land that separates us from God.

May the Lord fill us with the joy of mercy and reconciliation.

Amen.

Catechesis

The possibility of forgiveness

The question here is whether forgiveness is possible.

From forgiveness to reconciliation

He's apologized, but he's done it at least ten times! I don't know what to do. I'm told that, as a Christian, my duty is to forgive, and God knows I've tried. But every time I forgive him; the change is short-lived before he starts doing the same thing again. I feel like I'm going about this the wrong way. There's never any real change in him, and I'm getting angrier and angrier. What do you think I should do?

Do you see yourself in this testimony? I often meet people who are trying to forgive someone who has hurt them repeatedly. They know that forgiving is their duty as Christians, but they often feel that they are being taken advantage of or abused. They also have the unsettling feeling that by doing so they are enabling the selfish behavior of the person they are trying to forgive. Is this what forgiveness requiring?

Is it possible to forgive someone and refuse reconciliation? We should learn the difference between these two things. God always asks us to forgive, but forgiveness does not always lead to reconciliation.

Forgiveness and reconciliation: two different things

Jesus clearly warned us that God won't forgive our trespasses if we don't forgive those who trespass against us (Matthew 6:14-15; Mark 11:25). **We don't earn God's forgiveness by forgiving, but God expects those who have been forgiven to forgive in return (Matthew 18:21-35). That said, forgiveness is not the same as reconciliation.** It is possible to forgive someone without offering immediate reconciliation.

Forgiveness can exist in the context of our relationship with God apart from contact with the offender. Reconciliation, on the other hand, focuses on restoring broken relationships. When trust has been deeply broken, restoration represents a journey-sometimes a very long one.

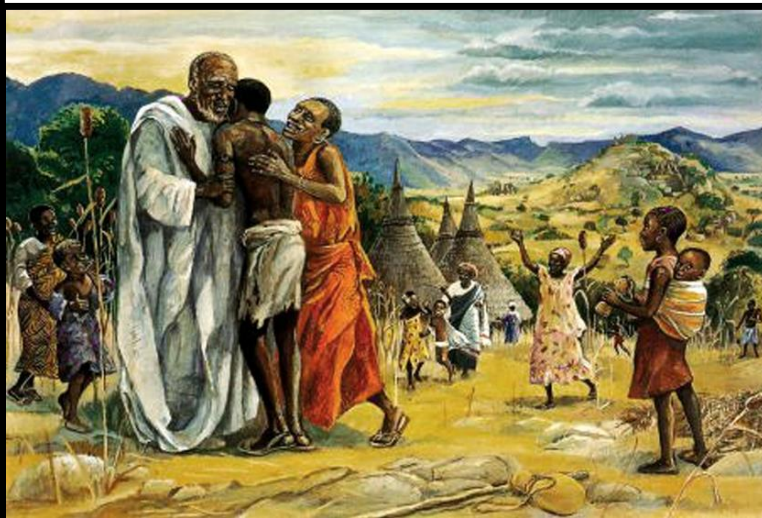
