



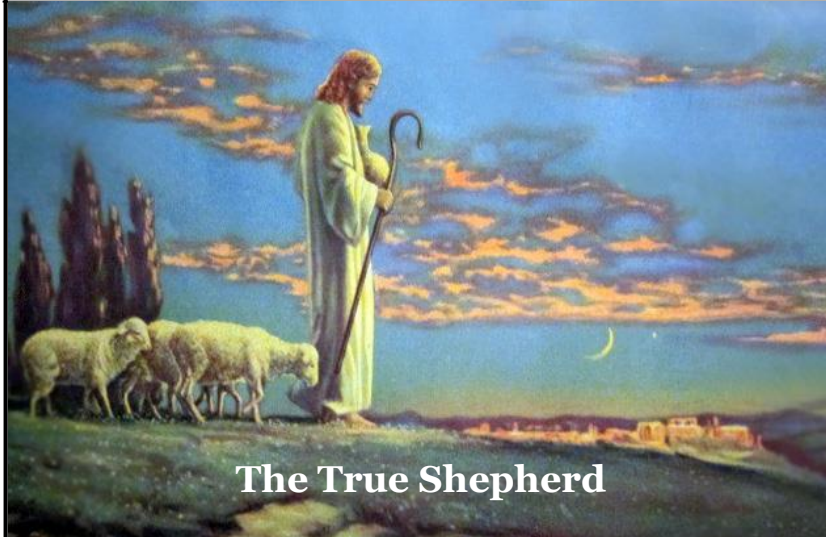

The True Shepherd

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus presents himself to us as the "good shepherd." "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me; I give them eternal life; they shall never perish, nor shall anyone snatch them out of my hand." These words of Jesus help us to understand that we cannot proclaim ourselves disciples of Jesus if we do not listen to his voice. It's not just a question of listening with the ear, but of listening with the heart. It commits us to following Christ, trusting him and putting into practice what he tells us.

In the noise of busy, everyday life, this is not always easy. We are often faced with difficulties, doubts and suffering. Many are disoriented by all the changes in our society, in our world and even in our Church. So we ask ourselves: who can we trust? Many say they don't need a master.

But this Sunday's Gospel shows us the close relationship Jesus wants to establish with each and every one of us: he is truly our guide, our Master, our friend, our model; above all, he is our Savior. This is the good news we have heard: "I give them eternal life, and no one will snatch them out of my hand."

To understand this, we turn to the cross of Christ. Pope Francis tells us that to save the lost sheep, the shepherd became a lamb, allowing himself to be sacrificed, taking upon himself all our sins to free us from them. Nothing and no one can tear us away from Jesus' hand, because nothing and no one can overcome his love. Jesus' love is invincible.

The first reading shows us a community in danger of closing in on itself. With Paul and Barnabas, the Gospel is proclaimed to the Gentiles. They understood that Christ is the "Light of the Gentiles" and the "Savior of all peoples."

The second reading is taken from the Book of Revelation: it shows us precisely the victory achieved by the martyrs. Its purpose is to remind us that even in the worst catastrophes, evil will not have the last word. Jesus is presented to us as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

On this Vocation Sunday, we join in the prayer of the universal Church. The good news of the Gospel is for all nations. It must be proclaimed in season and out of season. This day reminds us that Christ wants to involve us all in his mission as "Shepherd of all mankind."

We are thinking of priests, men and women religious, catechists, leaders of various pastoral groups, but also of all the baptized. We are not Christians for ourselves, to "save our souls," but to work with Christ, who wants to save the world.

As we celebrate this Eucharist, we turn to the one who exchanged his life for our salvation. We thank him for the hope and joy that is within us. May he enable us to be its bearers and messengers throughout our lives.

Catechesis

How does the election of the Pope take place?

From the voting of the cardinal electors to the counting of the ballots, which are then burned in a 1939 cast-iron stove, here are all the details of what goes on in the Sistine Chapel during a conclave.

The 133 cardinal electors called upon to choose the 267th Roman Pontiff, in the Sistine Chapel, will have in their hands a rectangular ballot paper with, on the upper half, the Latin inscription “Eligo in Summum Pontificem” and, on the lower half, “room to write the name of the elected.”

The procedure

Each cardinal-elect, in order of precedence, after writing the name of his choice on the ballot paper, folds the ballot paper, holds it so that it is visible and brings it to the altar, on which a receptacle covered by a sort of tray is placed.

“I bear witness to Christ the Lord, who will judge me, that I give my vote to the one whom, according to God, I judge should be elected.”

The stripping

Once all the cardinal-electors have placed their ballot papers in the ballot box with the tray, the first teller shakes the box several times to mix the ballot papers, then the last teller counts them, taking them one by one from the ballot box and placing them in another empty receptacle. If the number of ballots does not correspond to the number of voters, they must all be burnt and a second ballot taken immediately; if there is correspondence, the votes are counted.

Quorum requirements

For the election of the Supreme Pontiff, at least 2/3 of the votes are required. In the specific case of this conclave, which begins on Wednesday May 7, 89 votes will be required to elect the Pope, the number of cardinal electors being 133.

Voting procedure

Cardinals vote 4 times a day, twice in the morning and twice in the afternoon. After three days without white smoke, voting is suspended for a maximum of one day, for a prayer break, a free discussion among the electors and a brief spiritual exhortation, given by the first cardinal of the order of deacons. Voting then resumes.

The pope-elect

The future pope-elect will make his first public appearance on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, where red curtains have been installed. Before that, his reign name will have been revealed by the proto-deacon, French Cardinal Dominique Mamberti. He will also pronounce the formula "Habemus papam" on the balcony, in front of the faithful.

New pope profile

Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost was elected New Pope on May 8, 2025, becoming the first American to access the throne of Saint-Pierre. Born in Chicago in 1955, Pope Prevost is a regional Augustinian religious who has devoted a large part of his life to the missionary service in Peru, where he was bishop of Chiclayo. In 2023, he was named Cardinal by Pope Francis and led the powerful dicastery for the bishops, supervising the appointment of bishops around the world. His election marks a historic moment for the Catholic Church, breaking with the tradition that no pope had been from the United States. Pope Prevost is known for its moderate approach and commitment to marginalized communities, thus reflecting the pastoral legacy of Pope Francis. The Conclave was concluded quickly, less than 48 hours after opening, with the appearance of the white smoke above the Sistine Chapel, signaling the election of the new pontiff sovereign.
