WEEKLY REFLECTION

Why should Catholics pray for the dead?

Catholics pray for the dead because they believe in the ongoing journey of the soul after death—particularly the process of purification known as *purgatory*. According to Catholic teaching, not all souls are perfectly purified at the moment of death, even if they die in God's grace. Prayers from the living, especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, are seen as a way to help these souls complete their purification and enter fully into the joy of heaven.

This practice is deeply rooted in tradition and Scripture. One of the clearest biblical references comes from the Second Book of Maccabees, where prayers are offered for fallen soldiers so that their sins might be forgiven. Under the initiative of Judas, a collection was picked up among all his soldiers, amounting to two thousand silver drachmas, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice. (**2 Maccabees 12:38-46**). Here are other Scripture passages that reaffirm the need to pray for the dead.

Matthew 12:32: Jesus says that some sins “will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come,” which Catholics interpret as implying the possibility of purification after death—hence, the relevance of prayers for the dead.

1 Corinthians 3:15: Paul writes that a person may be saved, “but only as through fire,” which is often understood as a reference to purgatory—a state where souls are purified before entering heaven.

2 Timothy 1:16-18: Paul prays for Onesiphorus, who is believed by many scholars to have already died, asking that he “find mercy from the Lord on that day.” This is seen as an early Christian example of intercession for the dead.

Moreover, The Catechism of the Catholic Church also affirms this, stating that prayers for the dead are acts of love and solidarity that reflect the unity of the Church across time and space: “Those who die in God's grace but are not yet perfectly purified undergo a final purification—what the Church calls *Purgatory*. This is where prayers for the dead come in: “From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them... The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead...” (CCC **1030-1032**).

Based on Sacred Scripture and Tradition, we are encouraged to pray and request Holy Masses for our deceased loved ones. Nowadays, we are experiencing a lot of issues with funeral arrangements in our parishes. Many family members coming to our churches no longer practice the Catholic faith. As the result of this, after the funeral Mass is celebrated, those deceased are abandoned, no one to pray for them. This is why, we are implementing the offering during funeral Masses in order to celebrate Masses for the purification of their souls.

Sacrament of Infant Baptism: Infant Baptisms will take place on the **Fourth Sunday** of every month, parents and god-parents must attend two pre-baptismal classes prior to the Baptism. Please register your child.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes: RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. Catholic teachings on the afterlife

Catholic teachings on the afterlife are rich and deeply rooted in Scripture, tradition, and centuries of theological reflection. Here's a breakdown of the key elements:

1. The Immortal Soul

Catholics believe that every person has an immortal soul created by God. At death, the soul separates from the body but continues to exist eternally.

2. Particular Judgment

Immediately after death, each soul undergoes what's called the *particular judgment*. This is a personal reckoning before God, where the soul is judged based on its faith and actions during life. The outcome determines whether the soul enters:

- Heaven** (directly or after purification),
- Purgatory** (a temporary state of purification), or
- Hell** (eternal separation from God).

3. Heaven

Heaven is the ultimate goal: eternal union with God, perfect joy, and the fulfillment of every longing. It's described as the *beatific vision*—seeing God face to face.

4. Purgatory

Unique to Catholicism, purgatory is a temporary state for souls who die in God's grace but still need purification from the effects of sin. It's not punishment, but a merciful preparation for heaven. The living can assist these souls through prayers, Masses, and good works.

5. Hell

Hell is understood as the result of a soul's free and final rejection of God's love. It's not imposed by God but chosen by the individual. It represents eternal separation from God and all that is good.

6. The Resurrection of the Body

At the end of time, during the *Last Judgment*, all souls will be reunited with their resurrected bodies. This belief affirms the goodness of the body and the hope of a renewed creation.

7. The Last Judgment

Poukisa Katolik yo ta dwe priye pou moun ki mouri yo?

Katolik yo priye pou moun ki mouri yo paske yo kwè nan vwayaj kontinyèl nanm nan apre lanmò—sitou pwosesis pirifikasyon ke yo rekonèt kòm purgatawa. Selon ansèyman Katolik la, se pa tout nanm ki pafètman pirifye nan moman lanmò a, menm si yo mouri nan favè Bondye. Priyè moun vivan yo, espesyalman Sakrifis Sen Lamès la, yo wè sa kòm yon fason pou ede nanm sa yo konplete pirifikasyon yo epi antre nèt ale nan lajwa syèl la.

Pratik sa a byen anrasinen nan tradisyon ak Lekriti Sent yo. Youn nan referans bibliik ki pi klè yo soti nan Dezyèm Liv Makabe yo, kote yo fè priyè pou sòlda ki mouri yo pou peche yo ka padone. Anba inisyativ Jida, yo te ranmase yon koleksyon nan mitan tout sòlda li yo, ki te rive de mil drakm an ajan, ke li te voye Jerizalèm pou bay yon sakrifis espyatwa. (2 Makabe 12:38–46). Men lòt pasaj nan Lekriti Sent yo ki konfime ankò nesosite pou priye pou moun ki mouri yo.

Matye 12:32: Jezi di ke gen kèk peche “ki p ap padone, ni nan tan sa a ni nan tan k ap vini an,” sa Katolik yo entèprete kòm yon endikasyon de posiblite pou pirifikasyon apre lanmò—se poutèt sa, enpòtans priyè pou moun ki mouri yo.

1 Korentyen 3:15: Pòl ekri ke yon moun ka sove, “men sèlman tankou nan dife,” sa souvan konprann kòm yon referans a purgatawa—yon eta kote nanm yo pirifye anvan yo antre nan syèl la.

2 Timote 1:16–18: Pòl priye pou Onezifò, ke anpil entelektyèl kwè ki deja mouri, li mande pou l “jwenn mizèrikòd nan men Senyè a nan jou sa a.” Sa a wè kòm yon egzantp entèsasyon kretyen byen bonè pou moun ki mouri yo. Anplis, Katechis Legliz Katolik la afime sa tou, li deklare ke priyè pou mò yo se zak lanmou ak solidarite ki reflekte inite Legliz la atravè tan ak espas: “Moun ki mouri nan favè Bondye men ki poko pafètman pirifye sibi yon dènye pirifikasyon—sa Legliz la rele Pigatwa. Se la priyè pou mò yo antre an jwèt: “Depi nan kòmansman Legliz la onore memwa mò yo epi li ofri priyè an vòt pou yo... Legliz la rekòmande tou pou moun ki fè charite, pou moun ki renmen yo, ak pou yo fè penitans pou moun ki mouri yo...” (CCC 1030–1032).

Baze sou Lekriti Sakre ak Tradisyon, yo ankouraje nou pou nou priye epi mande Lamès pou moun nou renmen ki mouri yo. Sèjousi, nou gen anpil pwoblèm ak aranjman fineray nan pawas nou yo. Anpil manm fanmi ki vin nan legliz nou yo pa pratike lafwa Katolik la ankò. Kòm rezilta, apre yo fin selebre Lamès fineray la, moun ki mouri yo abandone, pa gen pèsenn pou priye pou yo. Se poutèt sa, n ap aplike ofrann nan pandan Lamès fineray yo pou nou ka selebre Lamès pou pirifye nanm yo.
