WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23

Dear brothers and sisters, last Sunday, the word of God invited us to persevere in prayer and to silently meditate on the "Our Father," which is the prayer of our Lord Jesus Christ himself. The texts of today's liturgy, the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time of the liturgical year C, invite us to meditate on our relationship with material goods and the ultimate end of our lives.

The first reading, taken from the book of Qoheleth or Ecclesiastes, begins with the famous slogan: "Vanity of vanities, all is vanity." The sacred author discovers in earthly life, which is the same for the foolish and the wise, the transitory nature of all things. He sees everything as "vanity." At the end of his earthly life, man takes with him none of the riches he may have amassed honestly and at the cost of enormous sacrifices.

In the Gospel, Jesus seems to be saying the same thing. Jesus begins by challenging the man who wants to make him the judge of material matters, then warns everyone against the temptation to accumulate fleeting and fickle earthly riches for oneself, to the detriment of the only imperishable good, the love of God and neighbor. Jesus illustrates his teaching with the example of a rich man.

Faced with his riches, this rich man does not think of his neighbor and forgets God. He is self-centered. He forgets that everything is vanity, as Qoheleth says, that is, fleeting and fickle. In reality, like St. Paul in the second reading, Jesus does not call for an ideological contempt for earthly goods, but condemns the desire to live only for oneself, indifferent to others and to God.

May the Lord grant us the right relationship with the goods of this earth, that is, to consider them as means to serve God and our neighbor, and not to absolutize them.

Sacrament of Infant Baptism: Infant Baptisms will take place on the **Fourth Sunday** of every month, parents and god-parents must attend two pre-baptismal classes prior to the Baptism. Please register your child.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes: RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. Catechesis – Spirituality

This virtue is essential for spiritual growth

Charity is a theological virtue that God instills in the soul at baptism. It plays an essential role in the life of a Christian and in their spiritual growth.

At baptism, the child or adult baptized receives sanctifying grace, which makes him or her an adopted child of God and erases original sin. In addition to this grace, the Lord also gives him or her the three theological virtues, which are faith, hope, and charity. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, these virtues "dispose Christians to live in relationship with the Holy Trinity. They have the Triune God as their origin, motive, and object" (CCC 1812).

These virtues are a free gift from the Lord which, unlike the cardinal virtues, cannot be acquired by merit or human effort: "They are infused by God into the souls of the faithful to enable them to act as his children and to merit eternal life" (CCC 1813). These three theological virtues are the guarantee of the presence and action of the Holy Spirit in the faculties of the human being. Faith enables Christians to believe in God, in all that He has revealed, and in what the Church invites them to believe. Through hope, Christians aspire to "the Kingdom of Heaven and eternal life," placing their trust in Christ's promises, relying on his will and the help of the Holy Spirit (CCC 1817). Finally, charity enables us to love God above all else and our neighbor as ourselves. For St. Paul, charity is the greatest of the three virtues: "Now these three remain: faith, hope, and charity; but the greatest of these is charity" (1 Cor 13:13).


Without charity, there is no spiritual growth.

If charity is synonymous with love, it is not just a human feeling, but a supernatural love that goes far beyond simple well-being. Charity encourages the soul to do good to others, and in particular to its enemies, out of love for God. It is a gift that Christians receive at Baptism and must continually ask for throughout their lives. Only in this way will it be possible for them to put God first and love their neighbor, even those who have wronged them. This is why St. Paul sums up charity as follows: "If I have no love, I am nothing" (1 Cor 13:3).

To grow spiritually, it is therefore necessary to ask for and exercise charity by loving God. How can we practice this virtue in our lives? By obeying God's commandments, by striving to bear Christian witness around us, and by resorting to the sacraments to increase grace within ourselves and overcome our own faults and sins.

It is also essential to try to love one's neighbor, for if the believer does not show his love through his actions toward others, his love is empty and meaningless. This is what St. Paul also notes: "If I have no charity, if I lack love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal" (1 Cor 13:1). So we must ask the Lord to increase charity in us every day, until we meet him in Heaven!




