WEEKLY REFLECTION

First Reading: Amos 8:4-7

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 113:1-2, 4-6, 7-8

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8

Gospel: Luke 16:1-13

Today's readings challenge us to reflect on the themes of social justice, the wise use of resources, and the deeper values that should guide our actions in the world. In the first reading, the prophet Amos addresses the corruption and exploitation of the poor by the rich. He condemns those who "trample on the needy" and use their power to unfairly gain more wealth. The message is clear: **God sees the injustice and will not let it go unpunished.** Amos warns that the day of reckoning is near for those who prioritize material gain at the expense of human dignity.

In our own time, this message is still relevant. There are many who manipulate systems for their own benefit, often at the expense of the marginalized and poor. We can even take a look on how some immigrants are being mistreated in many countries across the globe. The Scriptures call us to examine how we participate in the systems of wealth and power around us. Are we using our resources to build up the Kingdom of God, or are we exploiting others for our own gain?

In today's Gospel, we encounter a parable that, at first glance, seems somewhat puzzling. Jesus tells the story of a steward who, after being accused of wasting his master's goods, acts cunningly to secure his future by reducing the debts owed to his master. This behavior is morally unacceptable, yet, Jesus commends the steward for his "shrewdness." It is important to understand our Blessed Lord is not praising dishonesty, but rather the steward's ability to act with urgency and foresight. The steward is shrewd in the sense that he recognizes his need to make preparations for the future, even if it involves using the resources at his disposal in an unconventional way.

In a similar manner, Jesus encourages us to be shrewd and wise in our use of the resources God has entrusted to us—our time, talents, and treasures. Are we investing wisely in the things that truly matter, like relationships, faith, and service to others? Are we prepared for the eternal future by how we use what we have in this life? This is why Saint Paul urges us to pray for those in power or employers. We are not to forget that for those who are not guided by the Spirit of God, power or money can blind them and it does in most of the cases. For this reason our prayers are urgently needed. Let us pray for the wisdom to use our resources for the good of others, to be shrewd in our pursuit of eternal treasures, and to remember that we cannot serve both God and wealth. Amen

Sacrament of Infant Baptism: Infant Baptisms will take place on the **Fourth Sunday** of every month, parents and god-parents must attend two pre-baptismal classes prior to the Baptism. Please register your child.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes: RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. Catechesis

Catechesis on the steps to Sainthood

On Sunday September 7, 2025, His Holiness Pope Leo XIV has celebrated for his very first time the Holy Eucharist for the Canonization of two new saints, namely Pier Giorgio FRASSATI, 24 and Carlos ACUTIS, 15 at Saint's Peter square in Rome. Due to this joyous event, we have found suitable to give some insights on the steps to Sainthood. generally, when the Church declares a person to be a saint, we are assured they are in heaven and eager to intercede for us. It's important to mention that these steps on the way to declaring a person a saint have no set time limit. It Varies.

Step one: Grassroots Devotions

The Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of the Saints points out that it begins with a person's "fame for holiness" Do the faithful speak of these men and women and their exemplary lives, positive influence, apostolic fruitfulness and edifying deaths? the official process of looking into their cause for canonization can't begin until five years after they die. Although it rarely happens, the pope can waive this requirement.

Step two: The Diocesan Phase

Here, a petitioner is usually a religious order or the bishop of the diocese where the man or woman died. With a permission, a postulator is appointed to collect documents, testimonies and further evidence about the life and holiness of the possible saint. The one who at this step is named a "Servant of God".

Step three: On the way to Rome

When everything is collected and the bishop approves, the results are sent to Rome, to the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints. What the diocese has gathered is placed into a formal volume called the positio. A theological commission studies and votes on it. It then moves to the cardinal and bishops of the congregation for their vote. If it's Negative, the cause stops with no appeal. Affirmative, it is sent to the Holy Father. If he agrees, the person gets the title of "Venerable".

Step four: On the way to beatification

The next step on the road to sainthood is beatification. If the candidate is a martyr for the faith, he or she is immediately made a "Blessed". Others need a miracle recognized as happening through their posthumous intercession. This step is not easy. The miracle is commonly and normally a physical healing that medicine and science can't explain. The miracle is presented to Rome, and the Congregation for the Causes of Saints has a group of specialists, believers and nonbelievers, who examine the miracle, which must be complete and lasting and have no natural explanation.

Last step to Canonization

At this point, the cause moves toward the final step of canonization and the title of "Saint". It's necessary for this step one additional miracle that happens after the beatification. The requirements are the same as for the first miracle, and the miracle must be attributed to the intercession of the Blessed. If everything passes the committees, the results are presented to the Holy Father, who then makes the final decision about declaring this particular man or woman to be a saint and worthy of public veneration by the whole Church. Normally the canonization takes place during Mass at the Vatican
