

WEEKLY REFLECTION

Gratitude, a path to holiness

Brothers and Sisters The liturgical texts for this 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time in Year C invite us to reflect on how gratitude can transform our lives and our relationship with God. Let's think about the blessings we have received and how we can express our gratitude to God and to others.

WHEN PASSING through Samaria and Galilee on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus encountered ten lepers who began to cry out, from a distance: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" (*Lk* 17:13).

Moved by their plea, Jesus tells them: "Go and show yourselves to the priests" (Lk 17:14).

This scene reminds us that "God never turns his back on us when we turn to him. The Lord always listens to us when we pray. Let us not cease to pray with confidence, for in him we will always find light and strength."

ONLY ONE of the lepers who had been healed returned to thank our Lord: "and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks" (Lk 17:16). This person, moreover, was not an Israelite, but a Samaritan. Our Lord, on seeing this, said: "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" (*Lk* 17:17-18).

The other nine forgot about the person who had healed them and decided to go their own way.

Questions for meditation:

- What am I grateful for in my life?
- How can I express my gratitude to God and to others?
- What can I do to cultivate gratitude in my heart?

Verse for meditation:

"The Lord is good to all; he is full of compassion for all his creatures." (Psalm 145:9)

Objective:

- Cultivate gratitude in your heart
- Express gratitude to God and to others
- Deepen your relationship with God through gratitude

May this meditation help you deepen your faith and cultivate gratitude in your heart!

Parish Information

Sacrament of Infant Baptism: Infant Baptisms will take place on the **Fourth Sunday** of every month, parents and god-parents must attend two pre-baptismal classes prior to the Baptism. Please register your child.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes: RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. To register, please call the church office at (340) 775-1650.

CCD Religious Education/Faith Formation: CCD classes take place every Saturday from 9:00 AM - 12 noon.

Sacrament of Penance: Confession is the sacrament that allows us to admit our faults and develop humility, but the most profound part is we get to experience Christ's gift of mercy. Confessions will be on Wednesdays after the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, and on weekends 20 minutes before each Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Please call the church office at (340) 775-1650 whenever a family member or friend is seriously ill or hospitalized.

Healing Mass: A healing Mass is held the last Friday of every month at 6:00 pm.

Visiting the Sick: The parish priests visit the sick every Friday. Please call the office if you have a sick or shut-it that you would like added to the list for home visits.

Funerals: All funeral services begin at 10:00 a.m. No funerals are held on weekends. Arrangements must be made with the Church before funeral arrangements with the funeral home. Viewing in church is available, however, we encourage viewing at funeral home.

Catechesis

The Rosary, a prayer from the Bible

On October 7, we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. What does this devotion, to which the month of October is dedicated, remind us of?

The prayers and the twenty mysteries that make up the rosary have their origins in the New Testament.

A favorite prayer of many saints and popes over the centuries, the rosary remains a favorite devotion for many Catholics today. But what do we know about its biblical origins?

1. THE OUR FATHER

The Our Father, recited before each decade, is the prayer that Jesus himself taught his apostles in the Discourse on the Mount. It is recorded in the Gospel of St. Matthew, in the words of Jesus:

2. HAIL MARY


The Hail Mary prayer, recited ten times at each mystery, also has its roots in the Bible. These are the words addressed to Mary by the Archangel Gabriel, the Lord's messenger, at the Annunciation, followed by Elizabeth's praise at the Visitation.

3. GLORY TO THE FATHER

The Glory to the Father, the prayer that closes each decade, is a praise to the Holy Trinity. It is inspired by a passage of Sacred Scripture, when Saint Paul addresses the Christians of Philippi.

4. THE MYSTERIES OF THE ROSARY

The mysteries refer to a passage from the Bible. With each decade of the Rosary, Christians meditate on a mystery of Jesus' life described in the New Testament. "The Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer," said John Paul II, and its twenty mysteries are "a summary of the Gospel": they reveal to us the fundamental moments in the life and teaching of Jesus.


Sorrowful mysteries


With the Sorrowful Mysteries, we meditate on the sufferings and passion of Jesus Christ from Gethsemane to his crucifixion on Golgotha.

To meditate on these 20 chapters of Jesus' life is to imitate the example of the Virgin Mary, who "kept all these events in her heart" (Lk 2:51).
