Reflection: faith and hope in the resurrection

Reflection. Justin and nope in the resurrection

Brothers and sisters

This year, the Church celebrates the Commemoration of all the faithful departed (**November 2**) on Sunday. It's a day of *prayer and hope*, with faith in the resurrection at the heart of the message. Here are the readings for this year C, which fall on a Sunday.

- *First reading:* Book of Wisdom (Wis 3:1-6.9). This text emphasizes the fate of the righteous after death: their souls are "in the hand of God," and no harm can befall them, despite appearances. It's a powerful affirmation of the peace and divine protection that awaits the faithful.
- *Psalm: Psalm 26 (27)*, "The Lord is my light and my salvation." It expresses the believer's confidence in God in the face of death and adversity, proclaiming that the dwelling place of the Lord is his refuge and ultimate goal.
- Second reading: Letter from Saint Paul to the Romans (Rom 14:7-9, 10c-12). The apostle Paul reminds us that we belong to the Lord, both living and dead. Christ died and rose again to be Lord of the living and the dead.
- *Gospel:* The Gospel of Jesus Christ according to Saint John (Jn 6:37-40). In it, Jesus affirms that all those whom the Father gives him will come to him and that he will not reject them. He promises resurrection on the last day to anyone who sees the Son and believes in him.

Keys Points for reflection

- **Hope despite mourning:** Wisdom affirms that the righteous are at peace.
- **Jesus**, **the teacher of eternal life**: Jesus presents himself as the way to eternal life.
- **Belonging to Christ:** St. Paul's reading from Romans emphasizes that life and death are united in Christ. We live and die for the Lord.
- **Praying for the dead**: It's an act of charity, an expression of the communion of saints.
- **An eternal bond**: It is the bond of love that continues.
- **Life on earth**, our earthly life is a pilgrimage that leads to the Father's house.

Throughout November, we are therefore invited to pray for the souls of the faithful departed in purgatory, and for our loved ones. It is important for us to offer masses for their suffrages. And may the souls of the faithful departed by God's mercy, rest in peace.

Sacrament of Infant Baptism: Infant Baptisms will take place on the **Fourth Sunday** of every month, parents and god-parents must attend two pre-baptismal classes prior to the Baptism. Please register your child.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Classes: RCIA is the journey of faith by which interested persons become members of the Roman Catholic Church. The program instructs adults to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through Baptism and/or Confirmation and Holy Communion. CCD Religious Education/Faith Formation: CCD classes take place every Saturday from 9:00 AM - 12 noon.

Sacrament of Penance: Confession is the sacrament that allows us to admit our faults and develop humility, but the most profound part is we get to experience Christ's gift of mercy. Confessions will be on Wednesdays after the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, and on weekends 20 minutes before each Mass.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: Please call the church office at (340) 775-1650 whenever a family member or friend is seriously ill or hospitalized.

Healing Mass: A healing Mass is held the last Friday of every month at 6:00 pm.

Visiting the Sick: The parish priests visit the sick every Friday. Please call the office if you have a sick or shut-it that you would like added to the list for home visits.

Funerals: All funeral services begin at 10:00 a.m. No funerals are held on weekends. Arrangements must be made with the Church before funeral arrangements with the funeral home. Viewing in church is available, however, we encourage viewing at funeral home.

PRAYING FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

- In the Catholic Church, November is dedicated to remembering the dead, marked by two important holidays: All Saints' Day (November 1), which honors all saints, and All Souls' Day (November 2). These celebrations end the liturgical year and invite us to pray for the dead while giving thanks for the saints.
- According to the Catholic faith, praying for the souls in purgatory is an act of charity, a way of interceding for those who died in a state of grace but still need final purification before entering the bliss of heaven. The most powerful way to help them is through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Offering of the Mass: The Mass is considered a very powerful means of helping souls in purgatory. However, other prayers and devotions are also very important (imploring the Virgin Mary through the recitation of the Rosary).
- Prayer for the souls in purgatory obtains for us indulgences, which are remissions of temporal punishment due to sins.


